Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Library Commission (LC) recommend its work plan for the upcoming year 2026-27 (Attachment A). The current 2025-26 work plan is included for reference as Attachment B.

Policy Issues

City Council Policy CC-24-004 sets the procedures, roles, and responsibilities of Council-appointed advisory bodies, including the Library Commission (Attachment C). The policy requires that each advisory body develop an annual work plan, which will be the foundation for the work performed by the advisory body in support of City Council's annual priorities. The plan, once finalized by a majority of the advisory body, will be formally presented to the City Council for direction and approval no later than Sept. 30 of each year and then reported out on by a representative of the advisory body at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting at least annually, but recommended twice a year.

Background

On June 16, 2025 the Library Commission held a study session to update their work plan for 2025-26 (Attachment D).

On July 21, 2025 the Library Commission reviewed a draft update to its work plan for the year 2025-26 (Attachment E)

On Aug. 18, 2025 the Library Commission recommended its 2025-26 work plan (Attachment F).

On Sept. 30, 2025 the City Council revised the proposed LC 2025-26 work plan and approved it as revised (Attachment G).

On Oct. 20, 2025, the Library Commission received its approved work plan (Attachment H).

On June 15, 2026, the Library Commission held a study session on its work plan for 2026-27. (Attachment I)

On July 20, 2026, the Library Commission edited its work plan for 2026-27 and agreed to bring it back for further discussion at the August 17, 2026 meeting. (Attachment J)

Analysis

The Library Commission is tentatively scheduled to report out to the City Council on their current 2025-26

work plan on Aug. 25; and to recommend their new 2026-27 work plan to the City Council in September.

The Library Commission's current work plan for 2025-26 is provided for reference in Attachment B. The current goals include:

1. Acting as an advisory body to the City Council and a forum for the public on library issues:
 - Encourage robust public comment and participation at Commission meetings
 - Periodically review the library's public-facing policies and recommend updates, as required
 - Periodically receive staff presentations and reports about major library service areas
 - Periodically receive Commissioner liaison reports about affiliates
 - Support the filling of openings on the Commission and the effective onboarding of new Commissioners
2. Maintain a 12-month schedule of planned Commission agenda items
3. Review library programs and services, identify potential service gaps for specific age groups or affinity groups, and advise to fill needs to create the "library of the future".
4. Analyze and evaluate whether and how potential near or intermediate-term capital improvements to the 800 Alma St. facility may be addressed to better serve the library needs of the community.
5. Complete and recommend a report on the "library of the future" to the City Council in fall 2025 that will include a request that the City Council hold a study session focused on the library. Requests to add items to the City Council agenda should be directed to the City Council member serving as Library Commission liaison.
6. Support and advise library program development and operations of the Belle Haven Community Center (BHCC), including:
 - Belle Haven Community History project
 - Makerspace programming and policies
 - Other policies that may be impacted by shared spaces at BHCC

Recommendation

Policy Issues

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Library Commission (LC) review and provide feedback on the statistics and recent activities in the Library and Community Services (LCS) department outlined in this report.

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the LC is charged with advising the City Council on matters related to the City's libraries.

Background

LCS provides a wide range of lifelong learning and recreational opportunities for Menlo Park residents of all ages, abilities and lived experiences. Programs and facilities include public libraries, recreation and sports, early childhood education, after-school programs, summer youth camps, older adults (senior) services, athletic fields and courts, community events and aquatics.

Analysis

July statistics (Attachment A)

LCS collects statistics related to department activities. These data help to inform decision-making and improve services to the community. Monthly statistics for July 2026 are provided in Attachment A.

Suggestion box comments and responses (Attachment B)

LCS collects public feedback through physical suggestion boxes in public facilities and an electronic feedback form. A compilation of recent comments, along with responses prepared by City staff, is provided in Attachment B.

Bay Area Discovery Museum Try It Truck

On Tuesday, Aug. 11, from noon – 2 p.m., the Bay Area Discovery Museum Try It Truck visited Menlo Park's young scientists (children from transitional kindergarten through fifth grade) on the Menlo Park Library Lawn. Visitors learned about STEM problem-solving as they moved through a variety of design challenge stations. The event was well attended with approximately 122 visitors. This event received funding support from Friends of Menlo Park Library.

Summer Puppetry Festival

The City of Menlo Park libraries held the 9th Annual Summer Puppetry Festival with a series of free community programs starting on June 15. The series celebrated puppetry in its many forms, featuring

puppet shows and related events that showcase beloved performers and styles from throughout the Bay Area and beyond. Performances and approximate attendance counts are available in Table 1. The program series received funding support from the Friends of the Menlo Park Library.

Vehicle Licensing Fee Funding

The City of Menlo Park recently learned that the State of California is reducing San Mateo County's Vehicle License Fee (VLF) backfill allocation for fiscal year 2025-26 by \$101 million, increasing San Mateo County's total funding shortfall to \$226 million. The five-year forecast of the City's total share of the County's VLF funding shortfall could materialize as an additional \$5.2 million revenue shortfall if no legislative solution is implemented.

I understand that libraries serve diverse communities and that families hold different values. However, I strongly object to the library promoting a book with LGBTQ-related themes to elementary-aged children through a children's book club without clear advance notice to parents. Regardless of one's personal views on the topic, this is sensitive content for young children, and parents should be given the opportunity to decide whether and when their children are introduced to these subjects. My concern is not about whether the book should exist in the library collection. My concern is that it was actively promoted to young children in a structured program, where parents may have reasonably assumed the material would be age-neutral and broadly appropriate for elementary students. I am asking the library to take the following steps: 1. Provide parents with advance notice of all book club selections, including a brief description of themes that may be sensitive or values-based. 2. Allow parents to opt out of specific selections without their child being singled out. 3. Reconsider whether books involving gender identity, sexuality, or other sensitive social topics are appropriate for elementary-aged book club programming. 4. Establish a transparent review process for children's programming materials. I would appreciate a written response explaining how this book was selected, what age group it was intended for, and what safeguards the library will put in place	Hello, we post our book selection for the Middle Grade Book Group in a few different places. Below is a list of places where you can see the upcoming Middle Grade Book Group Schedule. [list includes fliers, event listings, email list, and bibliocommons list] All books that are chosen for this book group have a publisher's age range of 8 to 12. This is something that is explicitly stated on the website, flyers, and in the emails that are sent out to parents. The goal of Middle Grade Book Group is to encourage kids to read books that they might not otherwise read. We focus on choosing books based on the list of books the kids tell us they are interested in, while also leaving space for diversity. We want to be sure that all members of our community are represented in the books that we share. Discussing these books gives the kids opportunities to both see themselves in the stories they are reading and see other members of their community in these stories. We have read a wide range of books over the last two years including books about censorship, bullying, mental health struggles, racism and prejudice, disability, and identity. At the end of each meeting, there is a chance for kids to not take the books we are handing out. We present the question as a yes or no question and do not ask why a child is not taking the book in order to be sure the kids do not feel singled out if they don't want to participate in the following month's choices. We also leave it to the end of the meeting to give kids a chance to leave while we are handing out books if they are not interested. Every month we have at least two kids who do not take copies of the following month's books.

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Library Commission (LC) receive and prepare the draft Library Commission work plan milestone and deliverables calendar (Attachment A). The current 2025-26 work plan is included for reference as Attachment B.

Policy Issues

City Council Policy CC-24-004 sets the procedures, roles, and responsibilities of Council-appointed advisory bodies, including the Library Commission (Attachment C). The policy requires that each advisory body develop an annual work plan, which will be the foundation for the work performed by the advisory body in support of City Council's annual priorities. The plan, once finalized by a majority of the advisory body, will be formally presented to the City Council for direction and approval no later than Sept. 30 of each year and then reported out on by a representative of the advisory body at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting at least annually, but recommended twice a year.

Background

On Oct. 20, 2025, the LC received its approved work plan (Attachment D).

On July 20, 2026, the LC agreed to create a work plan milestone and deliverables calendar which would be brought back to the Commission each month for updates (Attachment E).

Analysis

Staff has prepared a draft milestone and deliverables calendar using the LC's five work plan goals for 2025-26 as an outline (Attachment A). The draft organizes the goals into five separate tables—one for each goal. Within each table, the larger, overarching goal is broken down into smaller milestones and deliverables, each listed on its own row, with a suggested date, frequency, or time range for completion. The dates and tasks listed within the draft are for illustrative purposes only and are intended to be edited at the direction of the LC.

The LC may request revisions, additions, or adjustments to the draft so that a final version can be adopted for use in tracking work plan progress. If adopted, the work plan milestone and deliverables would be edited and reviewed similarly to the Tentative Agenda Calendar, with changes being made by the Commission at each LC meeting.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the Library Commission does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund related to the topics in this report.

Environmental Review

This report is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.
