Study Session: Draft aquatic user survey 2025

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) review and comment on the draft aquatic user survey for 2025 (Attachment A).

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the PRC advises the City Council on matters related to the City's parks and recreation facilities.

Background

The City of Menlo Park owns and maintains two aquatic facilities: Belle Haven Pool and Burgess Pool. Both pools are operated by Menlo Park-based business Menlo Swim and Sport (Operator) under contract with the City of Menlo Park. The contract stipulates that the City will annually conduct a resident satisfaction survey about the aquatic programs. (Attachment A).

On Nov. 19, 2024, City Council received an informational report containing the 2024 aquatic user survey results. The 2024 survey received responses from 766 participants, approximately three-quarters of whom self-identified as incorporated City of Menlo Park residents, and 777 free-text comments were shared. (Attachment B).

On Oct. 14, 2025, City staff facilitated the first meeting of a Belle Haven Pool "hybrid model" task force comprised of Belle Haven neighborhood residents and stakeholders. At the task force meeting, participants expressed interest in adding questions to the aquatic user survey asking what times of day are most convenient for aquatic users to visit the pool. The agenda and notes from the task force meeting are available on the City's Aquatics webpage (Attachment C).

Analysis

As a starting point, the 2025 draft aquatics user survey in Attachment A utilizes the questions that were asked in the 2024 survey, in order to facilitate year-over-year comparisons.

Based on feedback received at the Belle Haven Pool task force meeting on Oct. 14, staff recommends retaining all of the questions from the 2024 survey, and adding the following new questions to the 2025 survey:

- What days of the week are most convenient for you to visit Belle Haven Pool?
- What times of day are most convenient for you to visit Belle Haven Pool?

- What days of the week are most convenient for you to visit Burgess Pool?
- What times of day are most convenient for you to visit Burgess Pool?
- Please tell us more about the days and times of the week that are most convenient for you to visit the pool.

City requests feedback from the PRC on the draft survey in Attachment A and the additional questions outlined above.

Staff is preparing to distribute the survey to Menlo Park residents in electronic and print formats, in English and Spanish, during November 2024, and to share results with the PRC tentatively Dec. 15.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the PRC does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund as a result of this report at this time.

Environmental Review

This report is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.










Burrowing Owls are cute little diurnal owls.

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Introduction

As 2024 dawned, Team Sheeper knew it was going to be a full and challenging year, but optimism and positivity allowed us to push forward. Fresh off agreeing to another 5-year agreement with the City of Menlo Park as the Aquatics Operator and rolling into our 18th year of operations at Burgess Pool (including 10 years of operation at the original Belle Haven Pool), we knew that all our business systems would be stressed and ultimately challenged as we were cautiously optimistic for the grand opening of Belle Haven Pool in May 2024.

The actual 8 month operation of Belle Haven Pool has turned out to be an insurmountable financial stressor on our business that without immediate, and foundational changes, Menlo Swim and Sport has no alternative but to cease all aquatic operations in Menlo Park.

Bold statements such as the one above warrant a detailed explanation of how Menlo Swim and Sport has arrived at this crossroads after 2 decades of successful operations. Steps for future improvement to the current crisis are also brought forward as a way of mapping a course forward for the long term health and viability of aquatics operation in Menlo Park.

The Belle Haven Pool Report

1.The National Challenge

"The most beloved public pools, when they receive good investment, attract Americans of many backgrounds, creating a space for people to swim and play together who might not otherwise interact. Like libraries and parks, they are an essential piece of social infrastructure in a Democracy."

"While public pools might simply seem like a nice place to spend a hot day, their influence and purpose are tightly woven into the historical issues of race, access and equity. As days get hotter, the problems of the American public pool system may become a more urgent part of the national conversation."

National Statistics from the CDC and USA Swimming Foundation:

- Drowning is the leading cause of death among 1-4 year olds
- Drowning is the 2nd leading cause of death by injury among children 5-14.
- Drowning is the 3rd leading cause of accidental death for Americans 24 years and younger
- Younger black adolescents are 3 times more likely to drown than their white peers.
- 8 in 10 drowning victims are male
- CDC estimates that drowning causes the US economy 53 billion each year.
- 79% of children in families with annual income under \$50,000 have no or low swimming experience.
- Children in households where a parent does not know how to swim only have a 19% likelihood of learning to swim, making the problem of swim knowledge a generational one.

Team Sheeper Opinion:

Despite the above startling statistics, water safety has been left to non-profit organizations and private operations. A Red Cross study looking at the reasons why people may not seek out swim lessons found that limited free time, limited lesson time, and affordability are the common obstacles.

We in Menlo Park and especially in the Belle Haven community have a pressing issue before us. We have a new world class pool and we need to focus on teaching our children the lifesaving skill of swimming. The pressure to do this must not fully fall onto the shoulders of the private aquatics operator, Team Sheeper, and our ability to partner with and raise private funds for public swim lesson scholarships.

The City of Menlo Park along with Team Sheeper need to align and collaborate in order to develop a long term and sustainable strategic plan of how to better serve the Belle Haven community now that an amazing aquatic center has been built in the neighborhood. A municipal swimming pool that draws people from the immediate community needs to have a bullet proof, sustainably funded, long term learn-to-swim program in place that does not solely depend on the ability of a contracted provider to secure funding in order to protect the community from drowning. This needs to be reviewed as a City of Menlo Park philosophy and mission.

The direct contribution for learn to swim programs in Belle Haven has mainly come from Beyond Barriers Athletic Foundation (BBAF)

-\$450,000 cumulative contribution from BBAF scholarships for Menlo Park youth from 2012 to 2024.

In 2025 the City of East Palo Alto granted BBAF \$20,000 to subsidize learn to swim programming at Belle Haven Pool.

Without Team Sheeper/Menlo Swim and Sport as the Belle Haven operator, BBAF may not be a sustainable contributor to swim lesson scholarships in Belle Haven for the future.

2. The Local Challenge

City-data.com and the US Census reports:

- The Belle Haven district of Menlo Park has a population of 4,063.
- 1492 children 0-14 years old
- 37.2% are families with children
- Most dense population per square mile compared to Menlo Parks other 4 districts
- 62% Hispanic, 12% Asian, 12% White and 10% Black
- Nearly 80% of Belle Haven pool users are Menlo Park residents and nearby neighbors

Team Sheeper Opinion:

The number of people the Belle Haven Pool is currently drawing from, simply does not support the City of Menlo Park's desired operational hours threshold of 63 hours per week on a year round basis.

While a long term aquatic community development and growth plan is put in place a seasonal and scaled approach to operating Belle Haven Pool would be a reasonable compromise to the current model. Seasonal Hours Proposal:

Summer 60-70 hours/week Spring/Fall 30-40 hours/week Winter 20-30 hours/week

Always 7 days per week and year round.

City of Menlo Park accountability for aquatic community development and growth plan:

- Devoting City Staff to proactive community outreach, development and communication projects related to aquatics in place of the current City Staff time being allocated to facility repairs, maintenance issues and other public works issues.
- Adopting a sustainable learn to swim program as a City initiative that begins in elementary school, including City funding for such programs.

3. The Menlo Park Agreement Challenge

- 63 hours per week of operations at Belle Haven immediately upon opening without a business and community building phase
- Below market hyper-local fees where fee deficits are absorbed by operator
- Master fee schedule oversight with resident, non-resident fee differential challenging market rates for non resident programming
- Below market rate lane rental fees
- Inability to alter basic business variables without City approval to prevent major financial losses
- Inability to have control of change/alteration timelines
- Revenue sharing regardless of company's loss position

Team Sheeper Opinion:

In order to continue serving the Menlo Park aquatic community during the agreement negotiation phase, Team Sheeper was put in the impossible position of starting up an operation while attempting to adhere to a highly restrictive agreement unlike any other agreement in its service history. The drastically increased City oversight afforded the operator no flexibility.

The entire agreement process was emotionally and politically charged, where trust in the operator to make experienced aquatics decisions in what is best for the community was greatly reduced. To add to the 2024 challenges there was a major disruption in the near 20 year historical pricing structure. A City initiative of achieving a 35% differential between resident and non-resident fees was expected in a short time span. This is extremely challenging when 45% of usage at Burgess is by non-residents, so increasing the fees abruptly and

steeply puts the operation at a high risk of losing customers. What compounds the challenge is that growth and profitability at Burgess is absolutely necessary to subsidize the losses of the Belle Haven operation.

Without meaningful and substantial suspension of the Aquatics Operator Agreement requirements the group to suffer most will be the community users of both Burgess and Belle Haven Pools.

4. The Financial Challenges

•	\$176,914	2024 Loss from Operations, Belle Haven Pool
•	\$110,347	2024 Profit from Operations, Burgess Pool
•	\$66,567	2024 Loss from Combined Menlo Park Aquatics operations
•	\$11,195	2023 Profit from Menlo Park Aquatics operations
•	\$212,000	2024-2025 Cumulative losses to date from Belle Haven operations

These Belle Haven losses represent entirely direct costs with no management overhead included

Team Sheeper Opinions:

The reason we are able to continue operating the Burgess and Belle Haven Pools when we are in a dire financial situation is because we are an experienced, stable company that is diversified and has revenue streams outside of Menlo Park to balance our 2024 and 2025 losses. In order to have the opportunity to improve the position we are in we had to adhere to the City timeline for bringing this issue before Council for review.

Our historical commitment and investment in the Menlo Park aquatic community kept us hopeful that our services are valued and our situation could be rectified once the opportunity presented itself.

The following is a summary of the changes we need to make to continue our service.

- Ability to alter and adapt operating hours seasonally aligning with community usage.
- Surgically increase user fees 0-10% and decrease the ramp of resident, non-resident differential to 10-15% in the short term while keeping senior fees increases between 0-3% annually.
- Increase lane rental fees immediately to \$20 per hour for non-profits and \$24 per hour for commercial operations
- Suspension of revenue sharing with the City until we are profitable as a whole

Team Sheeper is first and foremost an aquatics operator. Our mission statement is to serve as many people as possible from a wide spectrum of age groups with the end goal of individuals connecting with others in the community and personally becoming happier, healthier and stronger. We excel in producing high quality programming by recruiting, training, developing and retaining premium staff members.

It has deeply affected our staff members, company culture and operations in a negative manner when we recently had to reduce hours at Belle Haven Pool. By having to cut hours abruptly and drastically, it unnecessarily reflected negatively on the company and our ability and commitment to serve the community.

I believe that the current Belle Haven Pool situation is not a Menlo Swim and Sport issue...It is a City of Menlo Park issue first and foremost. It is time for the City to regroup and collectively work with Menlo Swim and Sport on developing policy and funding that will inject stability into the Belle Haven Pool for generations to come...well past the tenure of our private company.

There is a lot of human effort needed now and in the future to create a true center where people come together to feel connected, comfortable, safe and fulfilled. Menlo Swim and Sport along with the City of Menlo Park has recently met with a Belle Haven working group that has the desire and capability to passionately and creatively solve a few long term issues. This is a wonderful place to begin the journey.

Team Sheeper hopes to resolve its current challenges in order to take part and be a voice in that work, but we do not have the resources to lead this initiative nor do we believe this is only our issue to solve.



Narrative on Survey Comments:

Satisfied Respondents-It is greatly valued that individuals spend the energy to praise the operation.

Schedule and Accessibility-In a large majority of the comments it is an individual who loves their program who requests more time, more space or more freedom to enjoy more of their desired activity. As an example, it is a lap swimmer who wants more lap swimming, or a masters swimmer who wants more masters swimming.

Facility and Equipment-For decades, respondents have commented from a point of view that they want the facility and its features and amenities to match the level of customer service and level of programming that they have become accustomed to.

<u>Programs and Classes</u>-Respondants provide specific and detailed comments and suggestions regarding their program of choice. These are the comments that help the operator review and reflect on programming decisions.

<u>Pricing and Affordability</u>-Comments on alternative program pricing structures and offering feedback on market comparisons for programming.

<u>Cleanliness-</u>Comments in this category stem from most respondents having a deep affinity for the programs, facility and community. They desire that everyone treats the facility with care and leaves no trace so that all others can use it in a pristine condition.. The comments usually emerge from frustration against the ideal.

Audits and Reviews

When the question of "Standard of Care" is approached the discussion centers around the Model Aquatic Health Code (MAHC) developed by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) in 1959. The code has been updated every 15-20 years as the aquatic industry evolves, with the latest update in 2018.

Originally the MAHC was developed because of the massive growth of aquatic facilities in the middle of the previous century along with the major increase in 3 undesirable outcomes- water borne diseases, aquatic facility injuries, and drownings.

The code created a "language" and "methods" so public health staff overseeing aquatic facilities could communicate universally agreed upon standards with their operators to ensure that best practices (safest) practices were being implemented in the interest of the public.

In our case, the County of San Mateo regularly inspects our entire facility for compliance with the County Health Codes which are derived directly from the MAHC including, but not limited to our water quality, chemical storage, drain entrapment, sanitization methods and modes of record keeping, signage, pool structure, decks, and everything else related to water and people interfacing with it and around it. While we pass all of these inspections, we do use these inspections as a chance to test our operational prowess as all the inspections are "surprise" inspections. We have chosen to build a strong relationship with our inspectors, and they have proven to be very valuable to us in solving operational issues on occasion. Our inspector was especially helpful throughout the pandemic and their specific guidance allowed our operation to flow uninterrupted.


In 2024 Team Sheeper decided to employ the use of an outside auditor through the American Red Cross to ensure the highest standards of lifeguarding and aquatics specific management are maintained. This was a comprehensive audit that involved both documentation and live skills reviews. Team Sheeper has implemented all feedback and continues to train staff based on feedback received from auditor feedback and audit results.

Team Sheeper has implemented a new system to review lifeguard skills multiple times a day, called a quick check. During lifeguard quick checks the management team reviews lifeguard's rescue readiness, scanning, ratio of lifeguards to swimmers, and professionalism. In 2024 Team Sheeper management conducted 735 quick checks with a 94% pass rate. More significantly Team Sheeper lifeguards have a 98.2% passing rate on scanning, which is the most important preventative lifeguard skill.

Over the course of our tenure in Menlo Park we have encountered several different health inspectors and their preferences for what the dominant concerns are related to public safety. As an aside, as the result of going through more than typical 1-2 inspections per year, we inquired as to why we underwent so many more than that. We came to learn that our facility and overall operation was being used as a "model" where incumbent inspectors would use ours as a "training" facility for new inspectors.

We continue to keep safety and standards of operations at the top of our priority list. We follow county, state and private agency guidelines to ensure we are staying informed of all current and best practices.





Risk Management

We are proud of our staff's responses to medical emergencies on the pool deck and elsewhere in the facility where their quick decision making ability and application of training provided care and aid to patrons in need.

Our leadership team is composed of individuals with high integrity who are:

- · Rule followers
- · Risk assessment managers by nature
- · Protectors of all and shielders of the vulnerable

This ethos trickles down from the managers to the individual providers within our company as it's these individuals that the community typically interacts with which leads to their perception of overall facility safety. Safety is a facet of our operation that requires constant vigilance, attention and a great deal of energy. We have learned that creating good staff habits and expectations early in their tenure leads to optimal and highly functional team member's long term.

The public as well as staff safety is our #1 core value and our priority for the Menlo Park aquatic community. Risks are managed through the implementation of policies, procedures, daily practices, training, and communication. All staff as risk managers.

With water safety being our highest potential risk, we staff a minimum of one certified lifeguard and one lifeguard certified manager at all times. We increase the number of lifeguards on duty during times of high bather load such as swim lessons, team practices, and open swim reaching six or more lifeguards at peak operations. Team Sheeper also ensures that all lifeguards are rotated off scanning duty for a minimum of ten minutes every hour and half, exceeding minimum breaks and rotation standards of the Red Cross. Team Sheeper has also implemented a pilot test, mark, and protect swim test policy to keep our youngest and highest risk swimmers safe. All children under the age of 13 are required to complete a swim competency test in order to swim in the deep end of the pool. If they successfully complete the swim test, they are marked with a green wristband indicating they can swim in the deep end of the pool. This was piloted at the Belle Haven location this summer and will be expanded to all locations for the summer of 2025.

The communication of potential risks is an essential step in ensuring a safe environment. In addition to the verbal communication, signage, and other physical indicators of potential safety concerns we have developed procedures using email and website notifications to proactively make the aquatics community aware of potential risk. Examples would include abnormal water temperature, possibly unhealthy air quality index, and facility work or maintenance that may have possible hazards involved.

Certification expiration dates are closely monitored to ensure all personnel are appropriately qualified and up to date. We have a staff member dedicated to ensuring an audit is completed on all lifeguard staff. A great benefit is that we always have one or two Red Cross Certified Lifeguard Instructors on staff, that not only certify lifeguards for the entire region, but also recertify our own staff members on a timely basis. Our team certified over 225 lifeguards in 2024. If for some reason a staff member falls out of compliance and their certification lapses, they are immediately removed from that specific position until they are able to complete a recertification class.

Emergency Action Plan

We have gone to great lengths to ensure that we have a plan for as many possible incidents as possible along with factoring in flexibility to deal with the unknown.

All employees have access to a copy of our employee handbook, facility emergency action plan, and other safety procedures. Additionally all lifeguard staff have access and a personal copy of the lifeguard handbook and the American Red Cross Lifeguard Manual.

In addition to the facility emergency action plan that covers emergencies such as evacuations, earthquakes, fires, and chemical releases we have developed a water based emergency action plan. While all employees are provided training on our facility emergency action plan we focus heavily on our water based emergency action plan based upon this being our highest assessed risk.

Our water based emergency action plan is as follows:

- Two certified lifeguards are on duty at all times.
- Based upon pool activity 1-6 lifeguards will be on the pool deck.
- Each lifeguard will have a zone. Oftentimes these zones will overlap to provide increased safety.
- Lifeguards will continuously scan their zone taking no longer than 30 seconds to complete each scan.
- Each lifeguard will be positioned in such a way that they can recognize and respond within 30 seconds to any emergency in their zone.
- When a lifeguard recognizes an emergency they will blow their whistle 3 times to activate the EAP and perform the appropriate rescue.
- A second lifeguard will begin clearing the pool.
- The second lifeguard, or an additional lifeguard, will assist the rescuing lifeguard by retrieving the AED, backboard, first aid kit, and aiding in the extrication of the drowning person.
- The front desk staff, an additional lifeguard, or other staff member will ensure 911 is called.
- The front desk staff, additional lifeguard, or other staff member will meet EMS and escort them to the scene of the incident.
- The manager on duty will oversee the incident, ensure proper execution of duties, help facilitate communication, or assume an active role in the rescue if necessary.
- Once EMS has taken over care and the incident has ended the manager on duty will focus on the physical and mental health of our staff, ensure all documentation is completed, assess our ability to resume operations, and conduct an incident debrief when appropriate.

Drowning is defined as the process of experiencing respiratory impairment from submersion/immersion in liquid by the World Health Organization. Please note that there are three outcomes of a drowning event: non-morbidity, morbidity, and death. Non-morbidity means that there were no lasting injuries occurring from the drowning. Morbidity means there was lasting injury or impairment requiring medical attention. A fatal drowning is one resulting in death. Due to the fast response of the lifeguards and greater safety team, the one drowning that occurred this year was interrupted within the American Red Cross defined time frame (1.5 minutes) to prevent morbidity from occurring.

Safety Reports

Team Sheeper has invested a great deal of time and resources into the safety of our company. Each one of our programs has a manager that has been trained and is dedicated to ensuring safety throughout each department. Managers lead their monthly department meetings and are inspired by company principles to include a segment or agenda item that specifically addresses an aspect of safety that relates to the department. This year to add consistency and ensure the company reaches high safety standards Team Sheeper has introduced a new position, Head of Safety and Operations which oversees all sites and safety related matters. This position was introduced in June 2024.

RECREATION FACILITY USE GUIDELINES

Library and Community Services 800 Alma St., Menlo Park, CA 94025 menlopark.gov



Purpose

The City of Menlo Park strives to provide a safe, welcoming, pleasant, and comfortable environment for all visitors of City facilities. To that goal, all facility visitors are expected to adhere to these Facility Use Guidelines.

We welcome everyone to:

- Learn, discover, play, and enjoy City of Menlo Park facilities within the limits of their intended use
- Find facilities, equipment, and materials in good condition
- Feel safe and welcome
- Respect the rights of others to feel safe and welcome.

Visiting a City of Menlo Park recreation facility, including the premises and grounds outside a recreation facility, or participating in an event or program constitutes an implicit acceptance of these Guidelines and an acknowledgement of the right of City of Menlo Park staff to take any action they see fit while interpreting these Guidelines.

In case of an emergency, follow staff instructions promptly.

Prohibited conduct and activities

In consideration of all visitors and staff, the following activities are not allowed in City of Menlo Park recreation facilities, including the premises and grounds outside the facilities:

- Leaving a vulnerable adult or a child under the age of 11 unattended.
- Entering vacant classrooms or facility rooms unless approved by staff.
- Disturbing others by talking loudly or with other noisy activity—including any loud sound originating from any electronic device. Please do use headphones when listening to audio on any electronic devices.
- Conversing using a cell phone except in designated areas.
- Sleeping—as a safety precaution sleeping individuals will be awakened.
- Eating—except in the designated areas, or food provided at city-approved events.
- Drinking—except for covered beverages in the designated areas, or beverages provided at Library and Community Services-sponsored events.
- Presenting offensive and pervasive odor or odors that may make the use of the facility difficult for others.
- Bathing, shaving, haircutting, or washing clothes in the public restrooms.
- Leaving or storing personal belongings in program rooms, public spaces, or on the premises or grounds outside
 of facilities.
- Entering a facility without shoes or adequate clothing, including top and bottom.
- Bringing in animals other than service animals recognized under Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Leaving pets unattended and/or unleashed in outdoor areas near the facility, including but not limited to entryways, pathways, lawns, and outdoor seating areas.
- Bringing carts, bicycles, scooters, skateboards, or similar items into any facility or leaving them at the entranceexcept equipment that is designed and is being used for the purpose of assisting the mobility of persons with
 disabilities and/or equipment designed and being used to carry infants and children.
- Wearing skates or roller blades inside the facility.
- Changing a child's diaper—except in the designated area of the public restrooms.
- Blocking aisles, shelves, or any thoroughfare with personal items, or leaving items unattended at any timeexcept to use the restroom for a reasonable amount of time.
- Putting feet on facility furniture, rearranging the furniture, or using the furniture for other than its intended purpose.
- For programs that require parents to sign in and out their children, ONLY the parents or guardians (over 18 years old) designated on the program sign up form will be allowed to pick up and/or drop off the child unless otherwise communicated with staff. ID will be required.
- Only participants who are registered for the class or program may be in attendance
- Siblings of a participant may not join the class or program without registering
- Parents are allowed in classroom or program space only if approved by instructor or city staff. Otherwise,
 parents must wait in designated areas

- Bringing weapons of any kind into the facility.
- Harassing facility users or staff—including physical, sexual, verbal harassment or stalking.
- Bullying, intimidation, or retaliation directed at facility users or staff
- Selling, soliciting, or using illegal drugs on facility premises.
- Alcohol is prohibited, except at City-approved events.
- Soliciting money, donations or signatures, or the distribution or posting of any printed material without advance written approval of the City.
- Smoking, including using electronic and smoke-free cigarettes (vaping) inside or within 50 feet of the facility building.
- Vandalizing facility facilities, equipment, or materials.
- Removing facility materials from the building without permission from authorized City staff.
- Engaging in sexual conduct or lewd behavior.
- Viewing or displaying inappropriate, sexually explicit, or illegal material in the facility.
- Violation of any federal, state, or local public health orders, restrictions, protocols and/or guidelines
- Illegal activity of any kind will be reported to law enforcement.

Library and Community Services Events

Library and Community Services events are open the general public. Advance registration may be required for planning purposes or when space is limited. Events may be held on-site, off-site, or virtually. Event participants, whether onsite, offsite, or virtual, must comply with the Recreation Facility Use Guidelines.

Youth events are created for participating youth and their caretakers. Adults who are not accompanying a youth participant may be asked to leave the event.

While hosting a virtual event, Library and Community Services staff may take one or more of the following actions as needed to ensure compliance with these guidelines; mute attendees, lock the event after the program has begun, dismiss participants or take other actions as needed. During virtual events, participants may be asked to turn on their cameras so that staff can identify them. Unidentified or unidentifiable individuals may be removed from the event.

Enforcement

Failure to follow these Guidelines will result in the following actions:

- Individuals will be asked to leave the premises.
- Facility visiting privileges may be suspended for an extended period.
- Facility staff may call local law enforcement to aid in enforcing these Guidelines.
- Illegal activity in any facility may result in arrest and/or prosecution in addition to suspension of facility privileges.
- Customers who return to any City of Menlo Park facility before a suspension has ended may be charged with trespassing.

Additional information

- In case of an emergency, promptly follow all staff instructions.
- Theft or vandalism to City of Menlo Park property, or property of staff, or property of facility visitors is prohibited.
- State law permits staff to search purses, bags, parcels, briefcases, and other packages to prevent the theft of recreation equipment and materials and authorizes the detention for a reasonable period of any person using these facilities who is suspected of committing theft (California Penal Code section 490.5.)

statistics and recent activities

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) review and provide feedback on the statistics and recent activities in the Library and Community Services (LCS) department outlined in this report.

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the PRC is charged with advising the City Council on matters related to the City's libraries.

Background

LCS provides a wide range of lifelong learning and recreational opportunities for Menlo Park residents of all ages, abilities and lived experiences. Programs and facilities include public libraries, recreation and sports, early childhood education, after-school programs, summer youth camps, older adults (senior) services, athletic fields and courts, community events and aquatics.

Analysis

September 2025 statistics (Attachment A)

LCS collects statistics related to department activities. These data help to inform decision-making and improve services to the community. Monthly statistics for September 2025 are provided in Attachment A. The statistics template has been updated and new statistics added to be more comprehensive and to improve data usability. New additions to the statistics report include:

- Indoor room usage
- Pickleball and tennis court usage
- Picnic rentals
- Field rentals
- Recreation participation by month (previously enrollment was reported by season)
- Child care:
 - Hours of education and care provided
 - o Meals/snacks provided
 - o Ages of children enrolled

Suggestion box comments and responses (Attachment B)

LCS collects public feedback through physical suggestion boxes in public facilities and an electronic feedback form. A compilation of recent comments, along with responses prepared by City staff, is provided

in Attachment B.

PRC ad-hoc subcommittee - community "fun run"

The PRC ad-hoc subcommittee met on Oct. 14 to discuss details for the community "fun run" event tentatively planned to take place in late April 2026. A six-kilometer route traversing the Belle Haven neighborhood and Bedwell Bayfront Park was identified and is pending final approval from the police and public works departments. The subcommittee also discussed ideas related to potential event sponsorships.

Youth Advisory Committee resumes meetings (Attachment C)

The Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) held its first meeting of the new school year on Sept. 24. The committee members reviewed policies, discussed possibilities for an annual project, and prepared to receive a presentation and provide feedback about bicycle racks and bicycle safety from the Complete Streets Commission tentatively on Oct. 22.

New youth club at Belle Haven Community Campus (Attachment D)

The City of Menlo Park has organized a new youth club for middle school students. The new "Club 678" launched on Sept. 22, and offers a mix of recreational activities, light academic support, and leadership development. City staff guide youth attendees through hands-on projects, sports and games, digital media workshops, social activities and special events. Club 678 meets afterschool Monday through Friday afterschool at BHCC. Interested students can join by registering online (Attachment D).

October is National Bullying Prevention Month (Attachment E)

Kindness and empathy are essential aspects of individual well-being and building a strong community. The City of Menlo Park is participating in National Bullying Prevention Month by sharing information about bullying and how community service programs can help victims of bullying minimize the social isolation and harm to self-esteem that bullying can cause.

- City-run child care centers have developed lesson plans to educate students on the damage that bullying can cause.
- City libraries and recreation centers have "kindness action cards and "be a buddy, not a bully" bracelets available for free.
- The City communications team is organizing a "social media for CommUNITY day" on Oct. 22 by encouraging residents to share with the tag #MPCommUNITY2025.

Costumes for Kindness: Donation drive for Halloween costumes (Attachment F)

The City of Menlo Park organized a Halloween costume donation drive, "Costumes for Kindness," which ended on October 17. Approximately 160 donations of new and gently used costumes were distributed to students at Belle Haven Elementary School.

Halloweek! community events (Attachment G)

The City of Menlo Park's annual "Halloweek" of events is this weekend, and details for event dates have been announced. Halloweek is comprised of three events

- Halloween Parade and Carnival, Saturday, Oct. 25. Come in costume for a festive "people parade" through downtown Menlo Park where kids can trick-or-treat at local merchants. Enjoy crafts, entertainment and carnival games at nearby Fremont Park. aturday, Oct. 25, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. The parade will begin down Santa Cruz Ave. and finish at the carnival at Fremont Park.
- Pumpkin Splash, Sunday, Oct. 26. Wear your swimsuit for the floating pumpkin patches at Belle Haven Pool and Burgess Pool. Ticket price includes a pumpkin, decorations for the pumpkin, a goody bag, and additional time for swimming. Sunday, Oct. 26, at Belle Haven Pool, 100 Terminal Ave., from 11 a.m. –

noon and at Burgess Pool, 501 Laurel St., from 1 - 3 p.m.

• Trunk-or-Treat, Tuesday, Oct. 28. Trunk-or-Treat is a safe and fun way to bring joy to children and families while fostering community spirit. Instead of going door-to-door, kids go from car-to-car, with each vehicle's trunk decorated in a creative and festive Halloween theme. Trunk-or-treaters will receive a free trick-or-treat bag, with candy, music and fun for all. Tuesday, Oct. 28, from 4:30–6 p.m. at Belle Haven Community Campus parking lot, 100 Terminal Ave.

Cost of services study (Attachment H)

The City of Menlo Park is currently undertaking a cost of services study to evaluate and update the cost recovery for various municipal services, including those provided by Library and Community Services. The cost of services study will assess the costs associated with providing fee-for-service activities to help inform the structure of fees in the master fee schedule.

It is recommended that cities periodically review their fee schedules to ensure that fees being charged are not more than what is necessary to cover the reasonable costs of the governmental activity. The City of Menlo Park's last cost of services study was conducted in 2017.

By law, service fees may not exceed the estimated reasonable cost of providing the services for which they were levied. Understanding user fees can help the City:

- Gain an understanding of the actual cost of providing fee-for-service activities
- Make decisions on dedicating a funding source (user fees) for requested services so that the City
 can allocate tax revenues elsewhere to fund other important services
- Generate funding needed for appropriate staffing levels
- Transparency to City leadership regarding the cost of providing services.

Government Consulting Partners, Inc. has been selected to prepare the City's comprehensive cost of services study, which will include developing a cost allocation plan, calculating fully burdened hourly staff labor rates, and conducting a comprehensive fee and service charge study.

Onsite "spot surveys" of tennis and pickleball court visitors (Attachment I)

The City is conducting "spot surveys" at the Nealon Park and Kelly Park tennis and pickleball courts. The purpose of the spot surveys is to gain insight into how the courts are used by visitors and at what times of day. The survey will be open through November 12, with the results to be presented to the PRC tentatively on Nov. 19.

Bedwell Bayfront Park ranger services update

City staff and San Jose Conservation Corps (SJCC), the new service provider selected by City Council to provide ranger services at Bedwell Bayfront Park are on track to finalize the details of the service agreement and SJCC's services to begin tentatively the week of Nov. 17. The current service provider has agreed continue to provide ranger services at Bedwell Bayfront Park until SJCC takes over the responsibility so as to prevent any gap in services during the transition.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the PRC does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund related to the topics in this report.

Environmental Review

This informational item is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)Guidelines §§15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) receive the PRC work plan 2025-26 as revised and approved by City Council Sept. 30 (Attachment A).

Policy Issues

City Council Policy CC-24-004 sets the procedures, roles and responsibilities of Council-appointed advisory bodies, including the PRC (Attachment B). The policy requires that each advisory body develop an annual work plan, which will be the foundation for the work performed by the advisory body in support of City Council annual work plan. The plan, once finalized by a majority of the advisory body, is formally presented to the City Council for direction and approval no later than September 30 of each year and then reported out on by a representative of the advisory body at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting at least annually, but recommended twice a year.

Background

On July 23, 2025 the PRC recommended a proposed PRC work plan 2025-26 (Attachment C).

On Sept. 30, 2025, City Council revised the proposed PRC 2025-26 work plan by deleting item #6 and renumbering the remaining items (Attachment D).

Analysis

The City Council approved the Parks and Recreation Commission's work plan Sept. 30 with the following revisions:

- Deleted item #6: "Annually review departmental budget proposals, focusing on any impacts to parks and recreation services" from the list of goals."
- Renumbered items to reflect the deletion.

The approved work plan including the above-noted revisions is provided for reference in Attachment A.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund related to the topics in this report.

Environmental Review

This report is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.

- 2. Support and advise recreation program development and operations:
 - Review programs and services with a focus on the provision of high-quality programs and services for all Menlo Park residents
 - Ensure that the programs and services offered at the Belle Haven Community Campus (BHCC) (including
 aquatics) contribute to satisfying the needs of the neighborhood it serves and is integrated into a system
 that is accessible to residents of all ages and abilities throughout the City.
- 3. Review progress toward the goals in the 2019 Parks and Recreation Facility Master Plan (PRFMP).
- 4. Participate in park and recreation facility tours to build awareness of recreation systems.
- 5. Advise on topics related to the maintenance and upgrade of recreational facilities, prioritizing accessibility, safety, and sustainability.
- 6. Periodically review public-facing recreation policies and recommend updates, as required, with a special focus on policies that may be impacted by shared space operations
- 7. Periodically receive staff presentations and reports about major parks and recreation service areas and programs, other city departments, and the Youth Advisory Committee
- 8. Maintain a 12-month schedule of planned Commission agenda items, update and post for public review monthly.
- 9. Annually host City Council liaison at the Parks and Recreation Commission meetings.

Recommendation

City staff recommend that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) review this summary report on recent projects completed in furtherance of the goals in the Parks and Recreation Facilities Master Plan (PRFMP).

Policy Issues

As an advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) makes recommendations and serves as a forum for public input, commentary, and discussion related to recreation programs and facilities in Menlo Park. The PRC was a key stakeholder group involved in the development of the PRFMP in 2019 (Attachment A).

Background

Oct. 15, 2019, City Council accepted the PRFMP (Attachment B).

Feb. 27, 2024, City Council reviewed a proposed addendum to incorporate additional pickleball courts into the PRFMP, and no action was taken (Attachment C).

Analysis

The PRFMP is designed to provide a comprehensive road map to guide decision-making for the City of Menlo Park to maintain, manage, and develop its parks, open spaces, and recreation facilities for the next 20 years and to help provide the community with the recreational opportunities that they desire.

Summary of recent projects

City staff tracks progress toward the goals in the PRFMP and provides reports to the PRC and community as projects are completed in furtherance of those goals. What follows is a summary overview of major projects that were completed in 2024-2025 that address priorities identified in the PRFMP.

Belle Haven Community Campus (Attachment D)

The City of Menlo Park and its partners constructed a new multi-service public facility at 100 Terminal Ave in Menlo Park's Belle Haven neighborhood. Completed in May 2024, the Belle Haven Community Campus (BHCC) features 37,000 square feet of floor space on two levels, and is the new home to five community-serving programs that were previous housed in five separate facilities: Belle Haven Library, Belle Haven Pool, Belle Haven Youth Center, Menlo Park Senior Center, and Onetta Harris Community Center. BHCC is

an all-electric, zero combustion, net zero energy project with onsite renewable energy generation, battery microgrid, and electric vehicle charging stations. The project was built to LEED Platinum certification standards, and its structural design is resilient to serve as an emergency shelter. The facility is owned and operated by City of Menlo Park.

Burgess Park Playground (Attachment E)

The city completed upgrades to the Burgess Park Playground on June 1, 2024. A key focus was to provide more accessibility for children with all abilities, including new accessible playground equipment, a rubberized surface around all play areas and an ADA parking stall. Also added were a new play area sign, benches, picnic tables and fences adorned with decorative laser-cut oak leaf designs. Existing trees and the natural landscape were preserved. Utility lines and drains were installed in addition to improvements to grading.

Willow Oaks Playground and Dog Park (Attachment F)

The city completed multiple upgrades to Willow Oaks Park on June 29, 2024. Upgrades included playground revnovations, dog park enhancements, a new restroom building, resurfacing of the basketball court, and tennis court lighting upgrades. Updates to the playground were focused on accessibility. The dog park was enlarged and included a new surface and drinking station. Connectivity for the surrounding neighborhood was improved via a new pathway connecting Willow Oaks Park from the intersection of Pope Street and Elm Street and reconstructed pathways throughout the park. Picnic tables were added along with installation of utility lines and drains. Grading was also improved.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council..

Environmental Review

This action is not a project within the meaning of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines §§ 15378 and 15061(b)(3) as it will not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment.

Public Notice

Public notification was achieved by posting the agenda, with the agenda items being listed, at least 72 hours prior to the meeting.
