Advisory Body Vacancies: Consider applicants and make appointments to fill vacancies on various advisory bodies

Recommendation

Staff recommends the City Council consider applicants for appointment to vacant or expired term seats on the following advisory bodies:

- Complete Streets Commission (CSC)
 - Two (2) vacancies
- Environmental Quality Commission (EQC)
 - Two (2) vacancies
- Housing Commission (HC)
 - One (1) vacancy
- Library Commission (LC)
 - Two (2) vacancies
- Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC)
 - One (1) vacancy
- Planning Commission (PC)
 - Two (2) vacancies

The Finance and Audit Commission (FAC) does not have any vacancies.

Policy Issues

City Council Policy CC-24-004 (Attachment A) establishes the policies, procedures, roles and responsibilities for the City's appointed advisory bodies, including the manner in which members are selected.

Policy CC-24-004 also allows the City Council to schedule or waiver interviews of applicants. Aligning with current practice, the Planning Commission applicants will have an opportunity to address and respond to City Council questions at the April 14 City Council meeting.

Background

Annually, staff conducts a recruitment to fill advisory body vacancies that exist due to expiring terms, members terming out or unexpected vacancies (e.g., resignations). This recruitment involved an eight-week period of advertisements and announcements from Feb. 6 – April 3. Incumbent members who were expiring but not terming out were informed of their ability to apply for reappointment. One EQC and one PC Commissioner did not reapply to continue serving, all remaining incumbents did reapply for an additional term on their current commission. There were no incumbent members who termed out this year. Residents who expressed interest in serving or were not appointed in a previous recruitment were also invited to

reapply. Additionally, recruitment efforts included print and digital advertisements in English and Spanish, announcements at public meetings and Weekly Digest articles, culminating in 56 applications received.

Following City Council's appointments, the city clerk's office provides onboarding and orientation for the new members. This includes the oath of office, commissioner handbook, introduction of advisory body liaison staff, Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests filing (if applicable) and a copy of the Brown Act. For appointments made annually in April, the city clerk's office coordinates annual training in May or June. Training includes ethics, Brown Act and Public Records Act requests.

The city clerk's office regularly reviews all agendas and minutes, tracks attendance (Attachment B) and serves as the principal staff contact for all advisory body members. The City has designated staff to act as a subject matter expert and serve as a liaison between the advisory body and the City Council

Analysis

Pursuant to City Council Policy CC-24-004, members must be residents of the City of Menlo Park and serve designated terms of four years or through the completion of an unexpired term or as otherwise designated.

Residency for all applicants has been verified by the city clerk's office. In addition, CC-24-004 states the selection/appointment process by the City Council shall be conducted open to the public. Nominations will be made and a vote will be called for each nomination in the order received. Applicants receiving the highest number of affirmative votes from a majority of the City Council present shall be appointed. The number of votes for each City Councilmember is limited to the number of vacancies.

The city clerk's office has compiled all applications received and attached them to this staff report as Attachment C, with the applicants' personal contact information redacted. The redacted applications are also available for public viewing at City Hall during regular business hours or by request. Additionally, unredacted versions of the applications were made available to the City Council for reference, as applicants were encouraged to contact the City Council to discuss their interest in serving on an advisory body ahead of the April 28 City Council meeting. Attachment D lists all applicants including their residency District and Attachment E lists currently seated members and their residency District. These appointments can be made by the City Council at this meeting.

Lastly, the City Council also has the option to direct staff to reopen advisory body recruitment at their discretion.

Purpose
To define policies and procedures and roles and responsibilities for Menlo Park appointed commissions and committees.
Authority
Upon its original adoption, this policy replaced the document known as “Organization of Advisory Commissions of the City of Menlo Park.”
Background
<p>The City of Menlo Park currently has seven active Commissions. The active advisory bodies are: Complete Streets Commission, Environmental Quality Commission, Finance and Audit Commission, Housing Commission, Library Commission, Parks and Recreation Commission, and Planning Commission. Those not specified in the City Code are established by City Council ordinance or resolution. Most of these advisory bodies are established in accordance with Resolution No. 2801 and its amendments. Within specific areas of responsibility, each advisory body has a primary role of advising the City Council on policy matters or reviewing specific issues and carrying out assignments as directed by the City Council or prescribed by law.</p> <p>Six of the seven commissions listed above are advisory in nature. The Planning Commission is both advisory and regulatory and organized according to the City Code (Ch. 2.12) and State statute (Government Code §65100 et seq., §65300-65401).</p> <p>The City has an adopted Anti-Harassment and Non-Discrimination Policy (CC-21-0022), and a Travel, Meal, and Lodging Policy (CC-19-002), which are also applicable to all advisory bodies.</p>
Policies and Procedures
<p><u>Relationship to City Council, staff and media</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Upon referral by the City Council, the commission/committee shall study referred matters and return their recommendations and advise to the City Council. With each such referral, the City Council may authorize the City staff to provide certain designated services to aid in the study. • Upon its own initiative, the commission/committee shall identify and raise issues to the City Council’s attention and from time to time explore pertinent matters and make recommendations to the City Council. • At a request of a member of the public, the commission/committee may consider appeals from City actions or inactions in pertinent areas and, if deemed appropriate, report and make recommendations to the City Council. • Each commission/committee is required to develop an annual work plan which will be the foundation for the work performed by the advisory body in support of City Council annual work plan. The plan, once finalized by a majority of the commission/committee, will be formally presented to the City Council for direction and approval no later than September 30 of each year and then reported out on by a representative of the advisory body at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting at least annually, but recommended twice a year. The proposed work plan must align with the City Council’s adopted work plan. When modified, the work plan must be taken to the City Council for approval. The Planning Commission is exempt from this requirement as its functions are governed by the Menlo Park municipal code (Chapter 2.12) and State law (Government Code §65100 et seq., §65300-65401). • Commissions and committees shall not become involved in the administrative or operational matters of City departments. Members may not direct staff to initiate major programs, conduct large studies or establish department policy. City staff assigned to furnish staff services shall be available to provide general staff assistance, such as preparation of agenda/notice materials and minutes, general review of department programs and activities, and to perform limited studies, program reviews, and other services of a general staff nature. Commissions/Committees may not establish department work programs or determine department program priorities. The responsibility for setting policy and allocating scarce City resources rests with the City’s duly elected representatives, the City Council. • Additional or other staff support may be provided upon a formal request to the City Council. • The staff liaison shall act as the commission/committee’s lead representative to the media concerning matters before the commission/committee. Commission/Committee members should refer all media inquiries to their respective liaisons for response. Personal opinions and comments may be expressed so long as the commission/committee member clarifies that their statements do not represent the position of the City Council. • Commission/Committee members will have mandatory training every two years regarding the Brown Act and

parliamentary procedures, anti-harassment training, ethics training, and other training required by the City Council or State Law. The commission/committee members may have the opportunity for additional training, such as training for chair and vice chair. Failure to comply with the mandatory training will be reported to the City Council and may result in replacement of the member by the City Council.

- Requests from commission/committee member(s) determined by the staff liaison to take one hour or more of staff time to complete, must be directed by the City Council.

Role of City Council commission/committee liaison

City Councilmembers are assigned to serve in a liaison capacity with one or more city commission/committee. The purpose of the liaison assignment is to facilitate communication between the City Council and the advisory body. The liaison also helps to increase the City Council's familiarity with the membership, programs and issues of the advisory body. In fulfilling their liaison assignment, City Councilmembers may elect to attend commission/committee meetings periodically to observe the activities of the advisory body or simply maintain communication with the commission/committee chair on a regular basis.

City Councilmembers should be sensitive to the fact that they are not participating members of the commission/committee, but are there rather to create a linkage between the City Council and commission/committee. In interacting with commissions/committee, City Councilmembers are to reflect the views of the City Council as a body. Being a commission/committee liaison bestows no special right with respect to commission/committee business.

Typically, assignments to commission/committee liaison positions are made at the beginning of a City Council term in December. The Mayor will ask City Councilmembers which liaison assignments they desire and will submit recommendations to the full City Council regarding the various committees, boards, and commissions which City Councilmembers will represent as a liaison. In the rare instance where more than one City Councilmember wishes to be the appointed liaison to a particular commission, a vote of the City Council will be taken to confirm appointments.

City Staff Liaison

The City has designated staff to act as a liaison between the commission/committee and the City Council. The City shall provide staff services to the commission/committee which will include:

- Developing a rapport with the Chair and commission/committee members
- Providing a schedule of meetings to the city clerk's office and commission/committee members, arranging meeting locations, maintaining the minutes and other public records of the meeting, and preparing and distributing appropriate information related to the meeting agenda.
- Advising the commission/committee on directions and priorities of the City Council.
- Informing the commission/committee of events, activities, policies, programs, etc. occurring within the scope of the commission/committee's function.
- Ensuring the city clerk is informed of all vacancies, expired terms, changes in offices, or any other changes to the commission/committee.
- Providing information to the appropriate appointed official including reports, actions, and recommendations of the committee/commission and notifying them of noncompliance by the commission/committee or chair with City policies.
- Ensuring that agenda items approved by the commission/committee are brought forth in a timely manner taking into consideration staff capacity, City Council priorities, the commission/committee work plan, and other practical matters such as the expense to conduct research or prepare studies, provided appropriate public notification, and otherwise properly prepare the item for commission/committee consideration.
- Take action minutes; upon agreement of the commission, this task may be performed by one of the members (staff is still responsible for the accuracy and formatting of the minutes)
- Maintain a minute book with signed minutes

Recommendations, requests and reports

As needed, near the beginning of City Council meetings, there will be an item called "Advisory Body Reports." At this time, commissions/committees may present recommendations or status reports and may request direction and support from the City Council. Such requests shall be communicated to the staff liaison in advance, including any written materials, so that they may be listed on the agenda and distributed with the agenda packet. The materials being

provided to the City Council must be approved by a majority of the commission/committee at a commission/committee meeting before submittal to the City Council. The City Council will receive such reports and recommendations and, after suitable study and discussion, respond or give direction.

City Council referrals

The city clerk shall transmit to the designated staff liaison all referrals and requests from the City Council for advice and recommendations. The commissions/committees shall expeditiously consider and act on all referrals and requests made by the City Council and shall submit reports and recommendations to the City Council on these assignments.

Public appearance of commission/committee members

When a commission/committee member appears in a non-official, non-representative capacity before the public, for example, at a City Council meeting, the member shall indicate that they are speaking only as an individual. This also applies when interacting with the media and on social media. If the commission/committee member appears as the representative of an applicant or a member of the public, the Political Reform Act may govern this appearance. In addition, in certain circumstances, due process considerations might apply to make a commission/committee member's appearance inappropriate. Conversely, when a member who is present at a City Council meeting is asked to address the City Council on a matter, the member should represent the viewpoint of the particular commission/committee as a whole (not a personal opinion).

Disbanding of advisory body

Upon recommendation by the Chair or appropriate staff, any standing or special advisory body, established by the City Council and whose members were appointed by the City Council, may be declared disbanded due to lack of business, by majority vote of the City Council.

Stipends

Per Government Code §36506, the City is authorized to pay appointed Planning Commissioners by resolution. The City Council has adopted a resolution with an amount not to exceed \$200 per month per Planning Commissioner. Per the IRS (Internal Revenue Services), "public officer" also includes appointed members of advisory boards and committees and commissions. The Planning Commission stipend is taxable income and each member will receive a W-2.

Meetings and officers

1. *Agendas/notices/minutes*

- All meetings shall be open and public and shall conduct business through published agendas, public notices and minutes and follow all of the Brown Act provisions governing public meetings. Special, canceled and adjourned meetings may be called when needed, subject to the Brown Act provisions.
- Support staff for each commission/committee shall be responsible for properly noticing and posting all regular, special, canceled and adjourned meetings. Copies of all meeting agendas, notices and minutes shall be provided to the City Council, city manager, city attorney, city clerk and other appropriate staff, as requested.
- Original agendas and minutes shall be filed and maintained by support staff in accordance with the City's adopted records retention schedule.
- The official record of the commissions/committees will be preserved by preparation of action minutes.

2. *Conduct and parliamentary procedures*

- Unless otherwise specified by State law or City regulations, conduct of all meetings shall generally follow Robert's Rules of Order.
- A majority of commission/committee members shall constitute a quorum and a quorum must be seated before official action is taken.
- The chair of each commission/committee shall preside at all meetings and the vice chair shall assume the duties of the chair when the chair is absent.
- The role of the commission/committee chair (according to Roberts Rules of Order): To open the session at the time at which the assembly is to meet, by taking the chair and calling the members to order; to announce the business before the assembly in the order in which it is to be acted upon; to recognize members entitled to the floor; to state and put to vote all questions which are regularly moved, or necessarily arise in the course of the proceedings, and to announce the result of the vote; to protect the assembly from annoyance from evidently frivolous or dilatory motions by refusing to recognize them; to assist in the expediting of business in every compatible with the rights of the members, as by allowing brief remarks when undebatable motions are pending, if they think it advisable; to restrain the members when engaged in debate, within the rules of order, to enforce on all occasions the observance of order and decorum among the members, deciding all questions

of order (subject to an appeal to the assembly by any two members) unless when in doubt he prefers to submit the question for the decision of the assembly; to inform the assembly when necessary, or when referred to for the purpose, on a point of order to practice pertinent to pending business; to authenticate by their signature, when necessary, all the acts, orders, and proceedings of the assembly declaring it will and in all things obeying its commands.

3. *Lack of a quorum*

- When a lack of a quorum exists at the start time of a meeting, those present will wait 15 minutes for additional members to arrive. If after 15 minutes a quorum is still not present, the meeting will be adjourned by the staff liaison due to lack of a quorum. Once the meeting is adjourned it cannot be reconvened.
- The public is not allowed to address those commissioners present during the 15 minutes the commission/committee is waiting for additional members to arrive.
- Staff can make announcements to the members during this time but must follow up with an email to all members of the body conveying the same information.
- All other items shall not be discussed with the members present as it is best to make the report when there is a quorum present.

4. *Meeting locations and dates*

- Meetings shall be held in designated City facilities, as noticed.
- All commissions/committees with the exception of the Planning Commission, and Finance and Audit Commission shall conduct regular meetings once a month. Special meetings may also be scheduled as required by the commission/committee. The Planning Commission shall hold regular meetings twice a month and the Finance and Audit Commission shall hold quarterly meetings.
- Monthly regular meetings shall have a fixed date and time established by the commission/committee. Changes to the established regular dates and times are subject to the approval of the City Council. An exception to this rule would include any changes necessitated to fill a temporary need in order for the commission/committee to conduct its meeting in a most efficient and effective way as long as proper and adequate notification is provided to the City Council and made available to the public.

The schedule of Commission meetings is as follows:

- Complete Streets Commission – Every second Wednesday at 6:30 p.m.
- Environmental Quality Commission – Every third Wednesday at 6 p.m.
- Finance and Audit Commission – Third Thursday of every quarter at 5:30 p.m.,
- Housing Commission – Every first Wednesday at 6:30 p.m.
- Library Commission – Every third Monday at 6:30 p.m.
- Parks and Recreation Commission – Every fourth Wednesday at 6:30 p.m.
- Planning Commission – Twice a month on a Monday at 7 p.m.

Each commission/committee may establish other operational policies subject to the approval of the City Council. Any changes to the established policies and procedures shall be subject to the approval of the City Council.

5. *Off-premises meeting participation*

While technology allows commission/committee members to participate in meetings from a location other than the meeting location (referred to as “off-premises”), off-premises participation is discouraged given the logistics required to ensure compliance with the Brown Act and experience with technological failures disrupting the meeting. In the event that a commission/committee member believes that their participation is essential to a meeting, the following shall apply:

- Any commission/committee member intending to participate from an off-premise location shall inform the staff liaison at least two weeks in advance of the meeting.
- The off-premise location must be identified in the notice and agenda of the meeting.
- Agendas must be posted at the off-premise location.
- The off-premise location must be accessible to the public and be ADA compliant.
- The commission/committee member participating at a duly noticed off-premises location does not count toward the quorum necessary to convene a meeting of the commission/committee.
- For any one meeting, no more than one commission/committee member may participate from an off-premise location.
- All votes must be by roll call.

6. *Selection of chair and vice chair*

- The chair and vice chair shall be selected in May of each year by a majority of the members and shall serve for one year or until their successors are selected.
- Each commission/committee shall annually rotate its chair and vice chair.

G. Memberships

Appointments/Oaths

- The City Council is the appointing body for all commissions/committees. All members serve at the pleasure of the City Council for designated terms.
- All appointments and reappointments shall be made at a regularly scheduled City Council meeting, and require an affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the City Council present.
- Before taking office, all members must complete an Oath of Allegiance required by Article XX, §3, of the Constitution of the State of California. All oaths are administered by the city clerk or their designee.
- Appointments made during the middle of the term are for the unexpired portion of that term.

Application and selection process

- The application process begins when a vacancy occurs due to term expiration, resignation, removal or death of a member.
- The application period will normally run for a period of four weeks from the date the vacancy occurs. If there is more than one concurrent vacancy in a Commission, the application period may be extended. Applications are available from the city clerk's office and on the City's website.
- The city clerk shall notify members whose terms are about to expire whether or not they would be eligible for reappointment. If reappointment is sought, an updated application will be required.
- Applicants are required to complete and return the application form for each commission/committee they desire to serve on, along with any additional information they would like to transmit, by the established deadline. Applications sent by email are accepted.
- After the deadline of receipt of applications, the city clerk shall schedule the matter at the next available regular City Council meeting. All applications received will be submitted and made a part of the City Council agenda packet for their review and consideration. If there are no applications received by the deadline, the city clerk will extend the application period for an indefinite period of time until sufficient applications are received.
- Upon review of the applications received, the City Council reserves the right to schedule or waive interviews, or to extend the application process in the event insufficient applications are received. In either case, the city clerk will provide notification to the applicants of the decision of the City Council.
- If an interview is requested, the date and time will be designated by the City Council. Interviews are open to the public.
- The selection/appointment process by the City Council shall be conducted at a City Council meeting. The city clerk will ask each City Councilmember for their nominations; the number of nominations is limited to the number of vacancies. The candidate that receives a majority of nominations will be appointed. If there is a tie, multiple rounds of voting will occur.
- Following a City Council appointment, the city clerk shall notify successful and unsuccessful applicants accordingly, in writing. Appointees will receive copies of the City's Non-Discrimination and Sexual Harassment policies, and disclosure statements for those members who are required to file under State law as designated in the City's Conflict of Interest Code. Copies of the notification will also be distributed to support staff and the commission/committee chair.
- An orientation will be scheduled by the city clerk following an appointment (but before taking office) and a copy of this policy document will be provided at that time.

Attendance

- A compilation of attendance will be submitted to the City Council at least annually listing absences for all commissions/committee members.
- Absences, which result in attendance at less than two-thirds of their meetings during the calendar year, will be reported to the City Council and may result in replacement of the member by the City Council.
- Any member who feels that unique circumstances have led to numerous absences can appeal directly to the City Council for a waiver of this policy or to obtain a leave of absence.
- While it is expected that members be present at all meetings, the chair and staff liaison should be notified if a member knows in advance that they will be absent.

- When reviewing commissioners for reappointment, overall attendance at full commission meetings will be given significant consideration.

Compensation

- Members shall serve without compensation (unless specifically provided) for their services, provided, however, members shall receive reimbursement for necessary travel expenses and other expenses incurred on official duty when such expenditures have been authorized by the City Council (See Policy CC-19-002).

Conflict of interest and disclosure requirements

- A Conflict of Interest Code has been updated and adopted by the City pursuant to Government Code §87300 et seq. Copies of the conflict of interest code are filed with the city clerk. Pursuant to the adopted Conflict of Interest Code, members serving on the Complete Streets Commission, Housing Commission, and Planning Commission are required to file a Statement of Economic Interest with the city clerk to disclose personal interest in investments, real property and income. This is done within 30 days of appointment and annually thereafter. A statement is also required within 30 days after leaving office.
- If a public official has a conflict of interest, the Political Reform Act may require the official to disqualify themselves from making or participating in a governmental decision, or using their official position to influence a governmental decision. Questions in this regard may be directed to the city attorney.

Qualifications, compositions, number

- In most cases, members shall be residents of the City of Menlo Park and at least 18 years of age.
- Current members of any other City commission/committee are disqualified for membership, unless the regulations for that advisory body permit concurrent membership. Commission/Committee members are strongly advised to serve out the entirety of the term of their current appointment before seeking appointment on another commission/committee.
- Commission/Committee members shall be permitted to retain membership while seeking any elective office. However, members shall not use the meetings, functions or activities of such bodies for purposes of campaigning for elective office.
- There shall be seven (7) members on each commission/committee.

Reappointments, resignations, removals

- Incumbents seeking a reappointment are required to complete and file an application with the city clerk by the application deadline. No person shall be reappointed to a commission/committee who has served on that same body for two consecutive terms; unless a period of one year has lapsed since the returning member last served on that commission/committee (the one-year period is flexible subject to City Council's discretion).
- Resignations must be submitted in writing to the city clerk, who will distribute copies to City Council and appropriate staff.
- The City Council may remove a member by a majority vote of the City Council without cause, notice or hearing.

Term of office

- Unless specified otherwise, the term of office for all commission/committees shall be four (4) years unless a resignation or a removal has taken place.
- If a person is appointed to fill an unexpired term and serves less than two years, that time will not be considered a full term. However, if a person is appointed to fill an unexpired term and serves two years or more, that time will be considered a full term.
- Terms are staggered to be overlapping four-year terms, so that all terms do not expire in any one year.
- If a member resigns before the end of their term, a replacement serves out the remainder of that term.

Vacancies

- Vacancies are created due to term expirations, resignations, removals or death.
- Vacancies are posted by the city clerk in the City Council Chambers bulletin board and on the city website.
- Whenever an unscheduled vacancy occurs in any commission/committee, a special vacancy notice shall be posted within 20 days after the vacancy occurs. Appointment shall not be made for at least 10 working days after posting of the notice (Government Code §54974).
- On or before December 31 of each year, an appointment list of all regular advisory commissions/committees of the City Council shall be prepared by the city clerk and posted in the City Council Chambers bulletin board and

on the City’s website. This list is also available to the public (Government Code §54972, Maddy Act).

Roles and Responsibilities

Complete Streets Commission

The Complete Streets Commission is charged primarily with advising the City Council on realizing the City's adopted goals for complete streets, vision zero, climate action plan, and provide input on major land use and development projects as it relates to transportation. The Complete Streets Commission's responsibilities include:

- To advance the goals of the city’s newly adopted climate action plan by making alternatives to driving safer and more attractive
- Advise City Council on the implementation of the transportation master plan.
- Continue to advocate for and advise the City Council on planning and installing pedestrian and bicycle rail crossing and safe cycling/pedestrian infrastructure.
- Continue to support City Council in ongoing initiatives to improve access to Downtown and support downtown businesses.
- Continue to support the implementation of the Safe Routes to School strategy and advocate for community engagement, program continuity and engineering implementation.
- Continue to support City Council’s role as a stakeholder with regard to regional multi-modal and transportation demand management programs projects to increase

Environmental Quality Commission

The Environmental Quality Commission is committed to helping the City of Menlo Park to be a leading sustainable city that inspires institutions and individuals and that is well positioned to manage present and future environmental impacts, including the grave threat of climate change. The Environmental Quality Commission is charged primarily with advising the City Council on matters involving climate change, environmental protection, and sustainability.. Specific focus areas include:

- Climate Action Plan - Advise and recommend on the implementation of the climate action plan.
- Climate Resilience and Adaptation - Ensure that our most vulnerable communities have a voice in policies and programs to protect their communities from environmental impacts.
- Urban Canopy - Leverage best practices to advise/recommend on the preservation of heritage trees, city trees and expansion of the urban canopy; and make determinations on appeals of heritage tree removal permits.
- Green and Sustainable Initiatives – Support sustainability initiatives, as needs arise, which may include city-led events, habitat protection, healthy ecology, environmental health protection, healthy air, surface water runoff quality, water conservation and waste reduction.

Finance and Audit Commission

The Finance and Audit Commission is charged primarily to support delivery of timely, clear and comprehensive reporting of the City’s fiscal status to the community at large. Specific focus areas include:

- Review the process for periodic financial reporting to the City Council and the public, as needed
- Review financial audit and annual financial report with the City’s external auditors
- Review of the resolution of prior year audit findings
- Review of the auditor selection process and scope, as needed

Housing Commission

The Housing Commission is charged primarily with advising the City Council on housing matters including housing supply and housing related problems. Specific focus areas include:

- Community attitudes about housing (range, distribution, racial, social-economic problems)
- Programs for evaluating, maintaining, and upgrading the distribution and quality of housing stock in the City
- Planning, implementing and evaluating City programs under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974
- Review and recommend to the City Council regarding the Below Market Rate (BMR) program
- Initiate, review and recommend on housing policies and programs for the City
- Review and recommend on housing related impacts for environmental impact reports
- Review and recommend on State and regional housing issues
- Review and recommend on the Housing Element of the General Plan

Library Commission

The Library Commission is charged primarily with advising the City Council on matters related to the maintenance and operation of the City’s libraries and library systems. Specific focus areas include:

- The scope and degree of library activities
- Maintenance and protection of City libraries
- Evaluation and improvement of library service
- Acquisition of library materials
- Coordination with other library systems and long range planning
- Literacy and ESL programs

Parks and Recreation Commission

The Parks and Recreation Commission is charged primarily with advising the City Council on matters related to City programs and facilities dedicated to recreation. Specific focus areas include:

- Those programs and facilities established primarily for the participation of and/or use by residents of the City, including adequacy and maintenance of such facilities as parks and playgrounds, recreation buildings, facilities and equipment
- Adequacy, operation and staffing of recreation programs
- Modification of existing programs and facilities to meet developing community needs
- Long range planning and regional coordination concerning park and recreational facilities

Planning Commission

The Planning Commission is organized according to State Statute.

- The Planning Commission reviews development proposals on public and private lands for compliance with the General Plan and Zoning Ordinance.
- The Commission reviews all development proposals requiring a use permit, architectural control, variance, minor subdivision and environmental review associated with these projects. The Commission is the final decision-making body for these applications, unless appealed to the City Council.
- The Commission serves as a recommending body to the City Council for major subdivisions, rezoning’s, conditional development permits, Zoning Ordinance amendments, General Plan amendments and the environmental reviews and Below Market Rate (BMR) Housing Agreements associated with those projects.
- The Commission works on special projects as assigned by the City Council.

Special Advisory Bodies

The City Council has the authority to create standing committees, task forces or subcommittees for the City, and from time to time, the City Council may appoint members to these groups. The number of persons and the individual appointee serving on each group may be changed at any time by the City Council. There are no designated terms for members of these groups; members are appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the City Council.

Any requests of city commissions or committees to create such ad hoc advisory bodies shall be submitted in writing to the city clerk for City Council consideration and approval.

 Complete Streets policy is fundamentally about designing public infrastructure that serves all users — pedestrians, cyclists, transit riders, and drivers — rather than optimizing exclusively for car throughput. As a commissioner, I understand this means evaluating projects and policies through a multimodal lens, making recommendations that balance competing needs for street space, and helping the City translate its climate and mobility goals into concrete infrastructure decisions.
 My background sits at an intersection I believe is increasingly relevant to this work. As a Senior Product Manager at Adobe building conversational AI systems, I've spent years thinking about how to design experiences that serve diverse users with different needs and contexts — which maps more directly to Complete Streets thinking than it might first appear. Good street design and good product design share the same core discipline: understanding who your users actually are, what they need, and what happens when the system fails them.
 I also bring over 2 years of experience on Menlo Park's Housing Commission, where I developed fluency in the policy process, community engagement, and the way land use and transportation decisions interact. I understand how city commissions operate and how to make recommendations that are both principled and implementable.

 I want to join the Complete Streets Commission because this work is personal to me. I live on El Camino Real and I am an avid walker. Safe streets directly protect me, my neighbors, and my family every day — crossing El Camino is part of my daily life, and I see firsthand where our street design has not been intentional and the very real danger that creates. That experience gives me a grounded, pedestrian-first perspective that I

would bring to every recommendation this commission makes.

At the same time, I believe we are at an inflection point in how cities think about public space, and I want to help Menlo Park navigate it thoughtfully. As a Senior Product Manager working in AI, I've developed fluency in how emerging technology reshapes systems — and I see that dynamic playing out in transportation right now. The way we design streets today will determine how well our city adapts as mobility continues to change. I want to help ensure those decisions are made with intention, centering the needs of people who walk, bike, and use transit rather than treating those users as an afterthought.



Describe your understanding of the responsibilities of each advisory body you are applying to and how your personal community or professional experience relate to these responsibilities	The Complete Streets Commission reviews the city's proposed transit-related projects before they are presented to the City Council for approval. Our job is to assess the approach the city is proposing, propose changes if needed, and make our recommendation to Council. We take a lot of things into consideration such as the observations and experiences of people in the neighborhood, data (such as speed data and collision data), road usage and conditions, criticality vs other city projects, and the ability of the city to make equal investments in other locations across the city that face similar concerns. In this decision-making process, Commissioners play a really important role by providing the residents' point of view and the perspective of being who bike, walk and drive our streets every day. In my five years on the Complete Streets Commission, I have participated in reviewing over 50 transit projects across the city (from the Shuttle program, to Willow Road, to El Camino Real intersections... and much more!) and making recommendations to Council. I would be very excited to continue to serve on the Commission and continue this work. It's incredibly meaningful to be part of a committed group of residents trying to make our City streets more safe, accessible, and easier to navigate for all users. But we've got a lot more work to do. I think that the depth and breadth of my experience is beneficial

Both professionally and personally, I've always been dedicated to improving the communities I'm part of. I love that work. It seems to me that we are at our best as a community when we work together to find solutions to thorny problems, even when we start from very different points of view. And that's exactly what we do every month at Complete Streets Meetings! I appreciate that the City of Menlo Park affords residents the opportunity to contribute to the process. If re-appointed, there are a few things I would like to accomplish. I appreciated that the City Council, in reviewing the City's proposed Slow Streets Program, asked that we give weight in the ranking to the equitable distribution of improvement projects across the city. That's valid and it needs to happen. I will work to bring that lens and that priority into the Commission's 2026-2027 workplan and to have it inform our meeting agendas as well. Second, I have learned from being on the Commission that public outreach is hard. The city will make a sincere effort to advertise an opportunity to give feedback through numerous channels, but people will say that they didn't hear about it. I think we have to dive deeper into this and understand it better. Perhaps establish a set of consistent practices for public outreach that becomes our city's standard, and also ask neighboring cities what's working for them. Given that my career was in communications, I would like to contribute to this effort, if that's helpful to the City. As we go forward with the work to improve safety on our main traffic corridors that a lot of people use, this will be crucial. Lastly, I thought that the Vision Zero Action Plan made such a good point about schools -- that safety concerns and issues are very often similar across school zones, and it's a great opportunity for Menlo Park to look across all our schools (not look at them as individual projects) and identify systemic solutions that could be implemented in terms of bike and pedestrian infrastructure, and enhancing crosswalks and intersections. I think this would move us forward and would love to contribute to this effort.

As an advisory board member, I attend monthly meetings where the board discusses proposals and project updates; between meetings I keep myself updated on the goals of the commission and collect information on projects to discuss at the monthly meetings. In my two years on the commission so far, I have been involved in several subcommittees, each contributing to a different aspect of making Menlo Park's streets safer and more accessible to alternative modes of transit.

As a professional scientist, a significant part of my job involves reading and interpreting technical literature and using this to develop next steps, and I bring this skill to this advisory board position. I am also trained to analyze and complicated data and communicate it in an accessible way, expertise which is useful in determining the success of the implementation of complete streets initiatives and goals such as reducing vehicle miles traveled and preventing collisions. As a direct example, I am involved in a joint subcommittee with Environmental Quality Commission members which is looking to evaluate new metrics to more precisely describe vehicle miles traveled and the city's progress towards those goals.

As an engaged community member I have frequently attended city council meetings on topics of housing and transportation and am passionate about improving sustainability; the issue of multimodal transportation is personally of great interest to me as a frequent bike commuter and city shuttle user, as detailed in my response to the following question. I hope that my combination of enthusiasm for multimodal transit and skills in communicating data will continue to be of use on the CSC.

Describe why you want to serve on your preferred advisory body and what you hope to accomplish as a member

I believe I bring a useful perspective to the commission in this position as a member of the community that utilizes the full range of mobility options available in Menlo Park. I am most regularly a bike user on Menlo Park's streets. As a bike commuter, I have seen firsthand the benefits of infrastructure such as the buffered bike lanes on Willow Road and the joy of seeing other cyclists of all ages using it on my way to work. However, I have also experienced the difficulties involved when these bike lanes end abruptly in high traffic areas, or discovered other infrastructure which is lacking, and I would like to see improvements to promote safety and convenience. For example, with pilot programs including the Coleman Avenue bike lane and Middle Avenue parking coming before the Commission, I have been involved in key projects to improve the safe routes to school and promote biking in the next generation. As part of my contributions on the bike rack subcommittee, we identified locations where the lack of bike racks are an impediment to people biking and proposed using bike racks already in inventory to help relieve this problem.

In addition to my commute I will often bike, walk, or ride the bus to downtown Menlo Park and surrounding areas in order to visit the library or catch the Caltrain to San Francisco, and thus have personal experience with many aspects of many Menlo Park streets. For example, the accessibility provided by the city shuttle allows me more flexibility to reduce car dependence. I hope my current work on our El Camino Real bike lane subcommittee will further increase bike accessibility to downtown and surrounding areas, and connections to nearby cities. I have witnessed many changes to Menlo Park streets which have made biking safer and more convenient, and am passionate about helping Menlo Park continue on the path towards making the streets safer and more accessible to all modes of transit.





The accumulated shortage of housing on the Peninsula over decades has resulted in an unaffordable housing market for a growing share of even our relatively well-off neighbors. My colleagues, who are highly educated young professionals, including residents and graduate students who aspire to be the next generation of doctors and researchers, struggle to afford to live in Menlo Park, let alone the teachers, police, and other essential service workers whose work makes the city function. Since having two young kids, I realized that I want my kids to grow up in a city that is more socioeconomically diverse, and housing is one way to encourage such diversity in our city.

I hope to add oversight on the city's housing progress as an informed resident, making sure that we are in compliance with the state's requirements and ensuring that the city is honest about whether we are on track to meeting our stated housing goals. If the city is falling short, I hope to speak with key stakeholders such as fellow commissioners, city council members, developers, and community members to brainstorm ways to unblock and accelerate housing development. Finally, I would be excited to give early feedback on housing development proposals to help make Menlo Park a more welcoming, sustainable, and vibrant place to live.

My understanding of the responsibilities of the Environmental Quality Commission (EQC) is to advise the City Council on how best to enable Menlo Park to mitigate, manage and adapt to climate change, and to become a model of excellence for other cities as it relates to issues of sustainability. Tangibly, I understand this to specifically include advising the Council on programs and policies related to the protection of natural areas, recycling and solid waste reduction, air and water pollution prevention, water and energy conservation, the preservation and





The Housing Commission acts as the primary advisory body for the systemic health of Menlo Park's housing ecosystem. This involves not only technical oversight of various housing programs and policies, but also the more general task of evaluating and planning for the housing needs and vision of a future Menlo Park.

My approach to these responsibilities is shaped by a career in engineering, where my work has largely dealt with identifying bottlenecks and optimizing throughput in complex systems. I view the current housing shortage in part as a scaling and pipeline challenge, requiring a broad and holistic view to advance beyond the the status quo of incremental, conservative, overly complicated development. This perspective was sharpened by my personal experience in electrifying our home in Menlo Park - incorporating solar, battery storage, and heat pump installations. While these upgrades are part of a sustainable future, the arduous and lengthy permitting process I encountered served as a firsthand case study in how regulatory friction can stall and frustrate progress. I've also seen first hand, at council meetings and participation, how those with the loudest voices against change or sensible housing development can drown out the silent or otherwise unavailable those of the broader community.

We love our city, and want it to thrive as both a model of sustainable but ambitious and forward-looking housing development for all who want to live and work here as a community - not just the lucky few who got in early.

On the Housing Commission, I hope to apply my technical and personal experience in several related ways:

- * Streamline permitting pipelines to reduce the "cost of delay" for both homeowners and developers.
- * Advocate for high-density, transit-oriented zoning that treats housing as a scalable infrastructure need.
- * Modernize the city's housing stock to align with our decarbonization and

electrification targets.

We can be ambitious and bold in our approach to housing, without sacrificing values of sustainability and responsibility. I hope to be an advocate for those who want to live here but cannot, who are unable to attend city council meetings as counter to other prominent voices against housing, who want our city to evolve as a living model of growth and community, not as a stagnant memory of what was or could have been.

I hope to add oversight on the city's housing progress as an informed resident, making sure that we are in compliance with the state's requirements and ensuring that the city is honest about whether we are on track to meeting our stated housing goals. 



informed the plan. It's incredible to see how much this area has evolved since the plan was put into place (e.g. housing along El Camino Real south of Middle Ave, the Springline development north of Santa Cruz Ave, and the activation around the train station (e.g. Philz and Little Sky Bakery).

In terms of further implementation, I would love to see safe, protected bicycle routes along El Camino Real which connect with Palo Alto, Atherton, Redwood City, and beyond. Supporting multi-modal transit will be essential as our city continues to grow – this approach is healthier for residents, saves money for them, is better for the environment, and supports the village character and downtown vibrancy that we all appreciate.

Additionally, I would love to see our community and local businesses align around an answer for downtown vibrancy: business success + increased housing. Given that local business owners have concerns about the impact of removing parking spaces, I would love to see us first build 1-2 parking garages downtown, then build housing on the downtown parking lots provided this is supported by the ballot measure this fall. I would hope that this type of creative response would ensure businesses are supported and that housing near services and transit is built. Critically, if we do not meet our housing goals, we are subject to Builder's Remedy and lose control over what gets built in our city. I think we all agree that this is an outcome that must be avoided at all costs.

I would also like to see our city invite specific kinds of businesses to provide services to residents who visit downtown. Perhaps we could survey residents about what they'd like to see and then find local businesses to invite in. On my list would include a plastic-free refill station and a salad bar providing organic, locally grown, hearty salads.





2. Please tell us about your views of the Planning Commissions relationship with the City Council and the Commission's relationship with City staff?

With respect to the City Council, I see the Commission as serving both an advisory and regulatory role, fulfilling its established functions while supporting the City Council with an understanding of impact and value for items that affect the City now and into the General Plan future. As noted in Question 1, the Commission reviews land use and development matters, applies adopted city policies and ordinances in matters within its authority, and provides recommendations to the City Council on broader planning and policy issues. The City Council, as the elected body, sets overall policy direction and makes final decisions on larger legislative matters.

Given what I have read from published agendas, meeting minutes, and videos of proceedings, City Staff provides the Commission with technical and legal analysis, procedural guidance, and insight into Council priorities and applicable regulations. Commissioners, in turn, assess the information provided by City experts, review carefully, ask questions as needed, and make independent judgments while respecting that staff works within the priorities and management structure established by the City Council. To me, an effective Commission works best when there is mutual respect, clear roles, and a shared commitment to fair, transparent, and well-reasoned decision-making. I also understand that the Commission's relationship with City staff should be professional, collaborative, and respectful of clear boundaries.

3. What is your understanding of the time commitment that is necessary in order to be well prepared for Planning Commission meetings?

My understanding that the Planning Commission meetings constitute the most public facing time commitment for the Commission, however my assumption is that the real work occurs outside of meetings. Commission members must review the proposals to have a strong understanding of them prior to the meeting, as well as having any questions answered by City staff should the Commission member see a need for clarification on any item. Perhaps more importantly, there will be time invested on General Plan discussions and, I hope, listening sessions on the Downtown Specific Plan.

4. What major issues do you foresee the Planning Commission dealing with and what would the Commission's role be in dealing with these issues?

I believe the Menlo Park Planning Commission will be dealing with major issues including housing production and affordability, implementation of the state's housing requirements, the Downtown Specific Plan, future change in the downtown and El Camino Real areas, and updates to local rules needed

to stay consistent with state housing law. I also expect environmental justice, anti-displacement, design quality, traffic and parking impacts, and neighborhood compatibility to remain important considerations. The biggest challenge, in my eyes, is to balance somewhat competing needs for resources and space and the Commission can help the Council in this. The Commission's role is to review projects for consistency with the General Plan, zoning ordinance, and environmental requirements; make decisions on matters within its authority; and provide thoughtful recommendations to the City Council on broader policy questions. In my view, the Commission should help Menlo Park balance needed housing and economic vitality with neighborhood livability, fairness, and long-term planning goals.

5. What is your familiarity with the El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan and what are your ideas about how the implementation can be a success? Please include an explanation of what you define as success.

Having read the Plan, watched committee and council meetings and reviewed articles written about it, my understanding of the El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan is that it is one of Menlo Park's key tools for shaping growth, design, land use, parking, circulation, and the public realm in the city's downtown and along El Camino Real. I also understand that the plan has evolved over time, including amendments made to help implement the Housing Element and expand housing opportunities in the Specific Plan area. I see the plan as an effort to balance several important goals at once: encouraging housing and reinvestment, strengthening downtown vitality, improving walkability and the pedestrian environment, and preserving Menlo Park's character.

I would define successful implementation as producing visible, balanced results on the ground. Success means adding needed housing, including affordable housing, while also creating a downtown that is active, attractive, safe, and supportive of local businesses. It means projects should be well designed, fit their context, improve the public realm, and work well in terms of parking and circulation. With all of that said, the most important element of the plan is consistent and varied communication with the most important group - the citizens of Menlo Park. The Plan will cause disruption and change. That is inevitable. The key is how the Commission supports the Council in implementing the plan in a way that citizens understand why things are occurring and, perhaps most importantly, when they will be done.

2. Please tell us about your views of the Planning Commissions relationship with the City Council and the Commission's relationship with City staff?

I believe that an ideal relationship between the Planning Commission (PC), City Staff, and City Council is built on the following core principles: (1) clear understanding of roles – the City Council holds legislative authority, the PC provides expert technical recommendations (not lawmaking or legal advice) and approves certain development proposals, and City Staff delivers actionable data and analysis support; (2) collaborative relationship that integrates public input into work product, with PC and City Staff jointly preparing evidence-based and legally supported analyses for City Council's review; (3) transparency and accountability through clear reporting and rationales for recommendations—ensuring citizens understand how outcomes are reached, not just what they are; and (4) practical adaptability that prioritizes real-world constraints (budgets, timelines, community impact) over rigid processes, avoiding gridlock by focusing on solutions rather than politics.

The objective is to ensure decisions and outcomes are efficient and trusted by the public without sacrificing democratic principles and by allowing each body to excel at its defined function: City Council decides, PC advises, Staff executes.

3. What is your understanding of the time commitment that is necessary in order to be well prepared for Planning Commission meetings?

Preparing for Planning Commission meetings requires a significant time commitment to research proposals, review documents, and prepare statements to ensure effective input and participation. As someone who prioritizes structured meetings and efficient agendas, I recognize the importance of dedicated time to ensure my contributions support the Commissions' ability to complete critical tasks — such as approvals, assessments, and proposal reviews—for City Staff and City Council. To sum up, I am applying with the understanding that there is extensive work to be done outside of Planning Commission meetings.

4. What major issues do you foresee the Planning Commission dealing with and what would the Commission's role be in dealing with these issues?

The Planning Commission (PC) currently faces critical challenges in advancing affordable housing, preventing legacy resident displacement, addressing homelessness and NIMBY'ism, protecting land and historical landmarks from harmful development, reducing pollution to safeguard public health, and revitalizing downtown Menlo Park—all amid systemic underfunding from federal and state governments.

I believe the PC can effectively address these interconnected priorities not as a decision-maker, but as a catalyst for collaboration. By actively engaging with community-based organizations (CBOs), non-profits, large corporations, and small businesses through structured dialogue and transparent data sharing, the PC can amplify grassroots insights, establish realistic timelines and budgets, and strategically leverage existing tools—such as zoning frameworks, land-use plans, and public hearings—to drive tangible, community-led solutions.

5. What is your familiarity with the El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan and what are your ideas about how the implementation can be a success? Please include an explanation of what you define as success.

I believe true downtown success requires revitalizing Menlo Park's parcels while preserving existing architectural character, enhancing pedestrian accessibility and safety, expanding community services and residential opportunities, integrating pedestrian and bike networks, and managing parking to avoid conflicts with Santa Cruz Avenue businesses.

To revitalize downtown and ensure sustainable growth, Menlo Park must prioritize housing developments required by California law in a manner that honors our community's historic character using targeted incentives (i.e. tax credits, public benefit bonuses) while rigorously protecting local landmarks, small businesses, and neighborhood integrity. This requires deep community involvement, partnerships with local stakeholders (businesses, nonprofits, and neighborhood groups), and coordination with developers, City Commissions, staff, and Council to advance projects that balance preservation with progress.

As a commissioner, I also studied and provided feedback on dozens of residential projects and smaller commercial projects. My feedback is always intended to align with our city's zoning regulations, the principles of our General Plan and the specific objectives of our Housing Element, such as adding housing units, supporting local businesses, protecting our natural resources and ensuring connection and community for our residents.

2. Please tell us about your views of the Planning Commissions relationship with the City Council and the Commission's relationship with City staff?

The Planning Commission reviews and makes recommendations on significant development projects for which City Council is the final decision-making body. In my experience, roughly one third to one half of the Planning Commission efforts are on projects that will eventually be voted on by Council. When commissioners review such projects, they should surface issues and make recommendations that could eventually be useful to Council. I do this by asking probing questions of developers and staff and by recommending specific ways projects could be improved.

I have tremendous respect and appreciation for the work that city staff do with the Planning Commission. City staff provide most of the information commissioners receive about a project and typically include a recommended action for each project. Staff have a deep understanding of each project and of the relevant city and state regulations. I use all the content in the staff report to help me understand a project and then use discussions with city planners, the city's attorneys and developers to learn more.

3. What is your understanding of the time commitment that is necessary in order to be well prepared for Planning Commission meetings?

Preparing for Planning Commission meetings requires reviewing the full staff report, identifying questions to address during the commission meeting and occasionally engaging with staff ahead of the meetings on specific concerns. This could take anywhere from 3 to 30 hours, depending on the projects being reviewed.

To provide more valuable and comprehensive recommendations, commissioners should stay current on the priorities and preferences of the City Council. Commissioners should have a broader awareness of state housing regulations and regional development trends. Commissioners should also be involved community members with lots of ways to learn about the values and priorities of other Menlo Park residents.

4. What major issues do you foresee the Planning Commission dealing with and what would the Commission's role be in dealing with these issues?

I would expect the Planning Commission to review nearly all of the projects listed as "Under Review" on the Community Development department site, plus the anticipated revisions to the Springline Development Agreement and potentially revisions to other previously approved projects. I also expect the Planning Commission to eventually review proposals for developing affordable housing on the downtown parking lots.

The Commission's role would be to make recommendations that align with the city's Housing Element and General plan and do so with transparency and public input, as much as possible.

I'd also expect the Planning Commission to give input into the next update of the Housing Element, starting in 2029, if not earlier.

5. What is your familiarity with the El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan and what are your ideas about how the implementation can be a success? Please include an explanation of what you define as success.

As a Planning Commissioner, I worked on updates to the El Camino Real/Downtown Specific Plan that reflected the 2023-2031 Housing Element. I voted for modifications to zoning that could lead to denser infill in this high-resource area adjacent to the best public transportation options in our city. Successful development downtown and along El Camino would balance the city's need for much more housing, especially affordable housing, an economically vibrant downtown, better and more options for connectivity and attractive public spaces.
