Regular Business: Recommend updates to the picnic rental policy

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) recommend updates to the picnic rental policy (Attachments A and B).

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission may review and recommend updates to library and community services policies and procedures as the need arises.

Background

Library and community services departmental policies establish rules, expectations, and procedures for the operation and public use of department programs, services, facilities, and resources. Policies are available for public review in person at City recreation facilities, libraries, and online at the City of Menlo Park website (Attachment C).

Analysis

The purpose of the picnic rental policy is to clearly communicate the process and expectations for rentals of the picnic spaces. Proposed updates to the current policy are presented with a clean version of the updated policy showing all updates incorporated (Attachment B) and a markup of the current policy showing proposed additions in underline and proposed deletions in ~~strikethrough~~ (Attachment A).

Updates to the picnic rental policy include:

- Reorder and reformat the document to current City document standards
- Update timeframes and quantities for rentals
- Include additional guidelines for rentals
- Update contact information
- Make various typographical corrections and clarifications.

Impact on City Resources

As an advisory body to the City Council, the Parks and Recreation Commission does not authorize resource allocations. City budget authorizations are the sole purview of the City Council. There is no substantive impact to the City's general fund related to the topics in this report.

Picnic area reservations

The City of Menlo Park has picnic areas for rent at Burgess and Nealon Park. Without a reservation, these picnic areas are available for public use on a firstfirst-come, firstfirst-served basis.

- Reservations can be made at www.menlopark.gov, in person, via mail or fax.
- Picnic rentals are for public use only. Engaging in any commercial activities for private profit is prohibited.
- Residents can make reservations up to 9 months in advance. Non-residents and unincorporated residents **Reservations for all other rentals** can makebe makereservations up to 6 months in advance. **Weddings** can bebooked a year in advance.
- The City has the right to reserve and has and priority in reserving picnic areas for City programs and special events. In the event that a reserved picnic area is needed for City use or maintenance, the City reserves the right to reschedule, relocate, or cancel a previously approved reservation.
- No reservation is confirmed until the completed reservation form has beenis approved, all fees have been paid, and the insurance certificate is submitted. Approval is dependent upon intended use, availability, and applicants' agreement to abide by the terms and conditions listed herein.
- A \$15.00 service & handling fee will be assessed for all cancellations. The City requires a minimum of 24 hour written notification of any rental cancellation. All fees will be forfeited if events are cancelled without minimum notification.
- Picnic areas can only be reserved at Burgess Park or Nealon Park. All other park seating-areas are for public use on a firstfirst-come, firstserved basis.

Fees and amenities

Fees are based on **one hour** and **one area** of use and vary for residents, non-residents, and unincorporated residents of Menlo Park. To qualify as a resident, renters must submit a copy of a utility bill or rental/property agreement showing a current address within incorporated Menlo Park. Recommended ratio of tables to guests is approximately 1:8.



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Picnic groups may not exceed 400-150 people, even when renting all available picnic areas. If the picnic group exceeds the maximum group size for an individual picnic area, any or all of the following actions may be taken: The renter will be asked to reserve additional sites to accommodate the group size, staff may cancel the reservation, the renter will be denied future use of City of Menlo Park picnic sites. Renters are responsible for cleaning the picnic area after use and are required to remove all garbage from park and premises. Renters who fail to do so may be denied future use of picnic sites and facilities. No amplified music above 60 dBA is allowed in the park. To obtain a noise permit, please contact the City's Planning Department Community Development Director at (650) 330-6702 (60-days-day notice required). No vehicles are allowed on the park grounds. No stakes are allowed in the grass. There are no public access water sources in the park aside from the bathroom sinks and water fountains. There are outlets in the park, but other renters, unexpected outages, required maintenance, and additional factors could limit the availability of power sources. - On-site cooking of any kind is prohibited at Nealon Park. Grilling is only permitted at Burgess Park with a rental because of the existing BBQ grills.
- Use of any special equipment is restricted to the applicant and guests and must not be accessible to the general public.
- Usage of any special equipment in any City park without the proper permits and insurance is strictly prohibited. See insurance requirements below.

Liability insurance

A Certificate of Liability Insurance is required for all non-resident picnic rentals, and any picnic rentals (resident or non-resident) serving alcohol or using special equipment, such as, but not limited to, equipment listed in the section above. Use of special equipment without proper insurance and permits may result in the denial of future use of picnic areas and facilities

The certificate must be submitted at least one week prior to the rental date. No reservation will be confirmed without proof of insurance, and the City reserves the right to cancel your reservation if insurance is not submitted in a timely manner. Liability insurance can be submitted via email, regular mail, or faxed to us at 650-330-2242.



Informational Item: Update on Community Fun Run

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission receive an update on the planning of a community "fun run" event in April 2026.

Policy Issues

The Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) reviews recreation programs and services. The PRC assigns members to subcommittees through a majority vote of the commission.

Background

On April 23, 2025, the PRC Chair suggested during commissioner reports the concept of the PRC organizing a community fun run to support health and wellness and to highlight services being offered at the new Belle Haven Community Campus (BHCC).

On June 25, 2025, the PRC formed an ad hoc subcommittee to support planning for a potential fun run event and assigned Chair Lee and Commissioners Patel and Van Buren to serve on the ad hoc subcommittee (Attachment A).

On August 27, 2025, the PRC received an update on the planning for the fun run event (Attachment B).

On November 19, 2025, the PRC received an update on the planning for the fun run event (Attachment C)

Analysis

The ad hoc subcommittee met with city staff on September 9, 2025, October 14, 2025, December 9, 2025, and January 6, 2026, to advance planning for the event. The event is scheduled for April 25, 2026. The race route will begin and end at BHCC and will circle around Bedwell Bayfront Park. The race route is 6 kilometers.

The ad hoc committee has reviewed pricing and has provided feedback on event marketing and branding for event shirts and medals. Currently, the ad hoc subcommittee is assisting with efforts to secure sponsors for the event. They have been provided with a sponsorship guide to solicit local businesses' support for the event (Attachment D).

The ad hoc subcommittee is scheduled to meet again on February 10 and March 10, 2026.

Recommendation

City staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Commission (PRC) review and provide feedback on the statistics and recent activities in the Library and Community Services (LCS) department outlined in this report.

Policy Issues

As a duly appointed advisory body to the City Council, the PRC is charged with advising the City Council on matters related to the City's libraries.

Background

LCS provides a wide range of lifelong learning and recreational opportunities for Menlo Park residents of all ages, abilities and lived experiences. Programs and facilities include public libraries, recreation and sports, early childhood education, after-school programs, summer youth camps, older adults (senior) services, athletic fields and courts, community events and aquatics.

Analysis

December statistics (Attachment A)

LCS collects statistics related to department activities. These data help to inform decision-making and improve services to the community.

Suggestion box comments and responses (Attachment B)

LCS collects public feedback through physical suggestion boxes in public facilities and an electronic feedback form. A compilation of recent comments, along with responses prepared by City staff, is provided in Attachment B.

Recreation classes – winter enrollment and summer camps

Enrollment for winter 2026 recreation classes opened on Friday, Dec. 4, for hyperlocal Belle Haven residents, Saturday, Dec. 6, for Menlo Park residents, and Dec. 10 for non-residents. There have been approximately 1,400 enrollments since registration opened. Classes include fitness, dance, sports, gymnastics, music, drama, arts and crafts, lifelong learning, and more. Enrollment details and classes are available on the City's Activity Guide webpage (Attachment C).

Summer camp enrollment opens on Feb. 6 at 9 a.m. Summer camps are currently available to preview online (Attachment C).

Black History Month Events

In February, the City of Menlo Park is celebrating Black History Month to honor the cultural significance and impactful history of Black and African Americans, and to recognize that our society's rich diversity is one of our greatest strengths. The City has organized a number of events in recognition of Black History Month, including:

- Black Liberation Month Celebration (Attachment D): On Feb. 7, from 1 – 4 p.m., the Belle Haven Community Campus will host a celebration in honor of 100 years of Black History Month. The event will bring together culture, creativity, and reflection as attendees enjoy a walkthrough of Black history decade by decade, cultural entertainment, and complimentary refreshments.
- Black History Month Congolese dancing (Attachment E): On Feb. 3, from 3 – 6 p.m., at Belle Haven Community Campus, dancer Arnaud Loubayi will delight attendees with his vibrant Congolese dances for all ages.

Spot survey update - Nealon and Kelly pickleball courts

For thirteen weeks, from Oct. 17 – Jan. 15, the City conducted "spot surveys" at the Nealon Park and Kelly Park tennis and pickleball courts. The purpose of the spot surveys was to gain insight into how the courts are used by visitors and at what times of day. As of the close of the survey on Jan. 15, the survey had been taken 21 times. Survey results are available in Attachment F.

Seven survey respondents selected Kelly Park as their location, and all reported being there to play pickleball (Table 1). Fourteen survey respondents selected Nealon Park as their location, and all fourteen reported being there to play tennis (Table 2). Corresponding results and comments are available in the following two tables.

Gymnastics closure

The Arrillaga Family Gymnastics Center is closed due to storm-related water damage. City teams are working to repair the damage and safely reopen the gymnastics center as soon as possible. Participants have been contacted about class impacts, and refunds have been issued for cancelled classes. The closure is anticipated to extend into February as contractors work to completely repair the damaged areas and prepare the facility for reopening. City staff is developing temporary, limited gymnastics offerings at Arrillaga Recreation Center and Arrillaga Family Gymnasium, to be provided to currently enrolled gymnastics participants at no charge.

Parking lot closures for photovoltaic solar panels

City Hall rooftop system installation and the final phase of the Belle Haven Community Campus microgrid carport systems at Kelly Park began in mid-December, 2025 (Attachment G). The carport systems for City Hall, in the parking lot between City Hall and the Arrillaga Family Gymnastics Center, will begin in early February and should be completed in March.

All solar PV systems are scheduled to be completed prior to the Net Energy Metering (NEM) 2.0 deadline, April 14, 2026.

Facilities will remain open during typical hours, except for gymnastics, which is closed for unrelated water damage repairs.

Visitors to Kelly Field are encouraged to carpool or to use public transit to visit the facility during construction. Parking at Kelly Park for the BHCC solar carport will be impacted for the duration of the project.

Limited disruptions to parking at the Burgess Campus are expected during the upcoming installation of the rooftop system at City Hall. During the City Hall carport system construction, much of the parking lot between City Hall and the Arrillaga Family Gymnastics Center will be closed. Alternate parking locations will be available for the duration of the project. Alternative parking locations include City Council Chamber's lot (751 Laurel St.), Burgess Tennis Courts lot (corner of Laurel St. and Burgess Dr.), and the Burgess Baseball Field lot (on Alma St.). The very limited remaining parking in the lot near City Hall will be reserved for members of the public.





Which court are you visiting today?




